
#### **REGISTRATION FOR 2023 - 2024**

#### **IPAD/CHROMEBOOK DAMAGES & FEES**

If a device or accessory repair is required due to negligent use and/or intentional damage, all repair and/or replacement costs are the responsibility of the student and their parent(s)/guardian(s). The district will have the damage repaired or replaced and bill the parent(s)/guardian(s).

Examples of device and accessory damage: cracked or scratched screens, damaged keyboards, stripped/broken/lost charging cords.


#### **END OF THE YEAR REPORT CARDS**

## READING OVER THE SUMMER


