
ABSENT STUDENTS

Hello from the eCare School Nursing staff!!! We are excited to be a part of your school. For those of you who may not know us we are a group of experienced school nurses that are available to your children through telehealth technology. We are based out of Sioux Falls, ND and provide care to 82 schools and counting.

How does it work? At any time during the school day, a school staff member can request a consultation for a chronic or urgent health care need. Within minutes a registered nurse is available via video to assess the situation and advise the staff member on how to help your student. After the call is completed, the eCare school nurse will contact the student's parents as needed to communicate information about the visit, so if you see an unfamiliar number, (605)606-0556, it just might be the nurse! We see students for diabetic management, asthma, seizures, everyday injuries and much more.

Learning to Read

The process of learning to read is a complex one! Reading includes:

<u>Phonics:</u> the relationship between sounds and letters

<u>Word Recognition:</u> identifying high-frequency and sight words

<u>Fluency:</u> reading with speed and accuracy sufficient to support comprehension

Comprehension: understanding what was read Spelling and Writing: using what you have learned

to create something new

Supporting Reading

The simplest and most important way you can encourage your child's love of reading is by reading. Read, read, and read some more. Read to your child, read with your child, and let your child see you reading for pleasure. If you want your child to value reading, you have to show him/her that you do!



Encouraging Language

Reading with your child is very important. However, there are other things that you can do that will also help develop your child's language skills.

Tell your child stories. This helps build a love of language and provides an opportunity for you and your child to talk.

Talk with your child. Look for opportunities daily to talk with your child about the world around him/her. One easy idea is turn off the t.v. for a night and take a walk!

Visit the library regularly. Libraries provide wonderful children's programs and resources for free! The more people that your child talks with and the more language that he/she hears the better.
