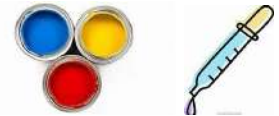
ART:

Rainbow Art

Make your own rainbow with whatever materials and colors you have at home



EXPLORE: Paint



-Fill 3 cups with colored water: red, yellow, and blue. (You can use food coloring, paint, or a marker soaked in water.)
-Use a dropper(or straw or medicine syringe) to paint the colors on a paper towel on a tray or cookie sheet. Watch them soak in and mix together to make new colors.

BRINGING IT ALL TOGETHER:



Take a walk and collect nature items such as fallen leaves, dandelions, twigs, etc.

Gather everything together at home. Talk about colors, textures, sizes, where did each item come from originally . . .

Ask your child what they think the first letter of each item is. They can write the letter on a paper and place it by the item.

MATH: Sort Recycling

With your child, sort the recycling at your house into piles: paper, plastic, glass, cardboard.

How do you think each of these things can be repurposed? How many of each do you have? Which has the most or the least?
