



Due to a grant from the Blue Hill Bank Charitable Foundation we will have a resident seismologist come into school and teach lessons on seismology with our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students. We have a seismograph in our building located in Mrs. Ficco's room that is back on line recording ground movement.



Teachers are receiving emails about earthquakes occurring around the world. As part of the program students will track earthquakes on maps in their classrooms. We sent home a list of things needed for the seismology lessons. If you can help out with any of these items it would be appreciated.

Enrichment Update

In March the Prescott experienced an excellent presentation from the "Traveling Photographer" - Richard Sobol! He is an award-winning photographer and has written several books based on living things around the world. Mr. Sobol shared what a fun and

unique job he has in taking photos of little seen wildlife in their natural habitats. He is a champion for conservation and you could see his passion in his work. He explained how he works on each book as a project that can sometimes take years to become a book. His travels have taken him around the world and as close as Cape Cod!

Mr. Sobol's program while sponsored partly by our PTO was also in part sponsored by a grant from the Norwood Cultural Council. The Norwood Cultural Council is a local agency funded by the Massachusetts Cultural Council.







In April the PTO brought us Prismatic Magic - Spring Jam! It was an exciting high-tech laser light show that had the students and faculty dancing and singing in their shoes! The show featured laser animations of Spring and was all set to the beat of popular music - trust us when we say our students knew many of the words and were singing along! It was a rewarding performance to help relieve the stress of testing and lots of school work!

News from First Grade...

Spring has sprung in first grade! For literacy, students have been working on a poetry unit. They have been reading and writing poetry. Students learned about sensory images. This is when they use their 5 senses to create an image in their mind. They use adjectives to describe things with their senses. Students also learned what an acrostic poem is as well! In May, we will start our unit on folktales and fairy tales! Be prepared to read some of the classics!

In Math, we are currently on Topic 12: Measurement. Students are learning how to measure objects with non-standard units (such as paper clips, etc.). This can be a fun activity to do at home: ask your child to measure things around the house with other objects. For example, how many forks long is the dining table? Have fun with it!

In science, students have been working on a plant unit! They practiced sorting seeds and cutting into a pepper to see how many seeds are inside. They planted sunflower seeds into peat pucks. We are caring for these in our classroom. Students will eventually take them home. You can transplant them outside and watch the sunflowers grow!


A couple things to be aware of that are coming up:

We are all so happy to be having better weather! Recently we have been working on identifying opposites, telling time to the hour and prepositions. During our community helpers week, we had the pleasure of having a real chef come in and do a cooking lesson with us. All of our students have made amazing gains in their independence and their gross and fine motor skills.

Coming up we will be having the themes: fairy tales, patterns, animal projects and symbols of America. Our classroom plants have grown so much and we are all eager to go and plant them in our plot.











News from Second Grade

Second grade has been working hard all year! Our Patriotic Performance will be on Tuesday, May 16th. Our literacy units this year have focused on community, animal habitats, and biographies. We will be ending the year with a unit on extreme weather. The past month we have been focusing on biographies. The students have read biographies about George Washington Carver, Helen Keller, Ruby Bridges, and many others. We have also discussed realistic fiction. There have been wonderful conversations about equality. Learning about different genres and different comprehension strategies has been fun!

Our second grade mathematicians have worked hard this year. We have learned many strategies to help us add and subtract up to 3-digit numbers. Our current topic is focusing on measurement. The students are learning about estimating measurements, using different tools to help them measure, and different units of measurement. We are excited to still learn about fractions, shapes, and review what we have learned this year.

As scientists we have learned about predicting the weather, the water cycle, and plants. This week we have been introduced to our larvae (caterpillar) and are excited to watch them transform into beautiful butterflies.

Students will be very familiar with both the content and the format of the exam through all of their work throughout the year in our Envisions math program.

We recently completed our Geology unit in Science in which the students studied the causes and effects of earthquakes. This unit also focused on the engineering process as the students met with peers from all three classes to design an earthquake-resistant building during our "Shake Tables" lesson. The students had a lot of fun and were excited to see how their designs held up during the testing step of the process. In Social Studies the students continue to learn about all of the events that led to the American Revolution. We had a visit from Colonial Trades during which the students each assumed the role of a colonist and practiced trading for goods and services with other colonists of various trades. 




News from 5th Grade...
