- Assessment took place late April through May 2016

Community Survey-For what purpose?

Purpose-to get student input about what we are doing well to support students when they are mistreated by a peer and what can we can improve on.

Participants-All Staff, Downey students

Consultant-Stan Davis/Youth Voice Project

"In the landmark Youth Voice Project research study, authors Stan Davis and Charisse L. Nixon add youth voices to the national debate about bullying and peer mistreatment. They surveyed more than 13,000 students in 31 schools in the United States to determine which actions were most helpful for bullied and mistreated youth.

Staff Survey Results:

53 Downey staff members participated in the survey.

How well is our school doing in	% responding Very Well or Well
Maintaining positive feeling/tone with students	96%
Treating all students respectfully	96%
Building connections with all students	94%
Maintaining professional and collegial staff-to-staff behavior	89%

Staff Survey Results:

Cont.

Listening to and supporting youth who are mistreated	88%
Enforcing consistent expectations about negative peer actions	83%
Helping youth who mistreat others change	77%
Empowering peer bystanders to support mistreated and isolated youth	75%

Student Results:

92 students participated in the survey. *Highlights from the student data...*

Question	Strongly Agree or Agree
Do you believe the discipline system (rules and consequences or punishments) at our school is fair?	87%
How many adults at our school do you have a positive relationship with? That means they welcome you to school and you would go to them if you need help.	96% answered "one or more"

Student Results cont.

Highlights cont.

Do you feel that you are part of this school?	98% reported Yes!
Do you feel valued and respected at school?	97% reported Yes!

Sample Questions and Results:

In the past month, how often have you seen other students do these things?

	Once a week or more often
Encouraging or supporting people	81%
Inviting people to sit with them or join them, including people	80%

Sample Survey Questions cont.

In the past month, how often have you done these things for another student?

	Once a week or more often
Encouraging or supporting people	84%
Inviting people to sit with them or join them, including people	80%
