V. School Climate & Culture:

- a. Community Meeting

b. Winter Carnival

 - a) Student's were held to an 'accountability standard' whereby
 - (1) Each student's classroom teacher needed to 'sign off' on a student's academic eligibility--daily--for the student to participate in the activities.
 - (2) Students deemed 'ineligible' reported to a 'targeted study hall' where they were afforded the opportunity & academic support to become current and improve their performance/grades within specific classes.
 - (3) Initially, there was a high number of students who were required to report to targeted study halls, but the numbers decreased throughout the week--as students met with teachers, completed assignments, and made substantial academic gains,--culminating with the majority of students participating in the 'Winter Carnival Day.'

c. Student Council

- Profile Student Council played a vital role in the implementation of Profile's Winter Carnival and Winter Carnival Dance, with both being highly successful.
- Student Council is working to plan a Spring Fling--school climate--Activity Day
 - a) Ways & Means to better implement the X-block model
 - (1) Presently, Administration & Guidance are reviewing recommendations to determine a 2017-2018 x-block plan.
