Expand your reading choices this summer with

Ms. Melissa's suggestions:

- ✓ Read two or more books by the same author
- ✓ Read a book by an author you have not read before
- ✓ Read a book by an illustrator you have not seen before
- ✓ Read a book that your parents read when they were young
- ✓ Read a book that was recommended to you by a friend
- ✓ Read a book that has won an award (*Caldecott, Newbery, Coretta Scott King, etc*)
- ✓ Read a book that has a plain or boring looking cover
- ✓ Read a book about a real person's life (*biography section*)
- ✓ Read a fairytale or folktale you have not read before (*398.2s in the nonfiction section*)
- ✓ Read a recipe in a cookbook and make that food with your parents
(*641s in the nonfiction section*)
- ✓ Read a book of poetry (*800s in the nonfiction section*)
- ✓ Read a book about a place that you have never been to (*900s in the nonfiction section*)
- ✓ Read 2 or more books about the same nonfiction topic
- ✓ Read a book that has been made into a movie, watch the movie after reading the book, and then compare and contrast the book and movie

Charlotte Mecklenburg Library ONE Access

With their ONE Access account, students can:

- Access Library research databases - **click on Elementary School and scroll to see many databases for research and ebooks (Tumblebooks and Hoopla)**
- Borrow digital materials such as e-books, e-audiobooks, magazines, music and video
- Borrow up to 10 print or audiobooks (no DVDs or music CDs)
- There are no overdue fines for ONE Access accounts, but users are responsible for fees on lost or damaged books.
- Login to ONE Access databases using the Student ID #
- The PIN (if needed) is the student's MM/DD birthdate. A student born on July 4 has a PIN of 0704 and a birthday of October 31 is 1031.

Tumblebooks (included in ONE Access)

TumbleBooks is a collection of animated, talking picture books which can be read by you or read to you! It includes story books, books in French and Spanish for language learning, read-along books, non-fiction books, puzzles and games.

- Go to ONE Access and click on Elementary School
- Scroll to the bottom to the "E-books and more" section
- Click on Tumblebooks
- Click on Access Now and log in with Student ID #
