- Utilized FV4 50/50 Grant Funds for Adobe Creative Cloud for the entire school
- Hired 4 students to work on the Bus Café
- FBLA District Contests: had 8 students qualify for individual and team events for State Leadership Conference (April 16-18 in Springfield)
- Three students work on the Bus through FLEX program during first hour
- Took over 20 students to FBLA event at Truman in October
- Will display student art from Desktop Publishing at the Art Show in April
- Included unit on Artificial Intelligence to Computer Science class during AI Externship with DESE
