Academic and Arts Education Combine

Curriculum Overview

The Pyne Arts core academic curriculum includes Readers and Writers Workshop, Foss Science Kits, Eureka and Envisions Math, and both social studies and civics programs, including Discovering Justice and Generation Citizen. Students also have daily intervention for math and reading with tiered supports to include LLI, Lexia, Read Naturally, Language!, iReady, and Algebra/Pre-Algebra. Lessons follow a Launch, Explore Summary progression and assessments include project-based learning.

Arts Programming

Students participate in a variety of allied

arts courses beginning in kindergarten. They include drama, general music and band, technology education, content literacy, computers, physical education, visual art/sculpture, and health. In addition, students receive social emotional education from the Social Thinking Curriculum monthly from our social worker and guidance counselor.
