
ir + a + infinitive



When you talk about things you are planning to do in the future, you say what you are going to do.

To talk about activities you are **going to do,** use the formula: ir + a + infinitive Here's some examples of this formula used in English:

- I am going to study.
- We are going to talk.



Primero, vamos a conjugar el verbo "ir". Ir means to go.

| Yo | voy | Nosotros(as) | vamos |
|---------------|-----|--------------------------|-------|
| tú | vas | vosotros | |
| Él, ella, Ud. | va | Ustedes, ellos, ellas | van |

<u>Remember</u>! An infinitive is a verb that ends in -ar,-er, or -ir. You **don't** have to conjugate them for this formula!

1. I am going to eat.

Yo voy a comer.

2. Eric is going to drink. Eric va a beber.



3.Olivia and Antonio are going to play sports.

Olivia y Antonio (Ellos/Uds.) van a jugar deportes.

- 4. Mario and I are going to turn. Mario y yo vamos a doblar.
- 5. We are going to review.

Nosotros vamos a repasar.
