

bitter (adj.) a harsh, bad taste (p. 11)


senses (n.) sight, sound, smell, taste, and touch are the five senses (p. 4)



Introduction

Touch

What have you tasted today?






Sight

Our eyes take pictures.


They send the information

Taste

Foods we eat can be sweet, salty, sour, or **bitter**.

We use our tongue to taste our food.



Air carries smells inside our nose. Our nose sends the smells to our brain.

Sound

Sound is all around us. We use our ears to hear all the sounds and noises.
