- <u>Daily Homework</u>: Read 20 minutes daily, five days a week, outside of class for a total of 100 minutes/week

Week 6 - Notice and Note ~ Memory Moment & Introduction of Class Novel

- <u>Daily Homework</u>: Read 20 minutes daily, five days a week, outside of class for a total of 100 minutes/week

Week 9 - Review/Assess, Test Taking Strategies, Create "Books to Read Next" List

- Reader's Theatre/One Act Play
- Common Reading Vocabulary Test Terms and Test-Taking Strategies
- <u>Daily Homework</u>: Read 20 minutes daily, five days a week, outside of class for a total of 100 minutes/week

*Topics of study include: Genre, Short Stories/Poems, Non-Fiction texts and Literary Elements, Prefixes/Suffixes/Roots, in addition to Independent Reading, Book Clubs and Class Novel Study

- 2. **Technology Resources Used:** iPads, Chromebooks, Internet, Promethean Board, Apps (Audible, Hoopla, OverDrive, Quizlet, Freerice)
- 3. **Materials Needed:** Random Reading book, pencil and notebook.
- 4. Student Work Required: Complete all assignments and tasks.

Time on Task Expectations:

- **Arrive on time** (if tardy, you need a pass to be excused--white slip). Any tardy after 3, will result in an half hour detention. *Tardiness after 3 times = more detentions*
- Pay Attention (be alert, awake, engaged and not interrupting others)
- Actively read during independent reading times
- Arrive prepared and with <u>all</u> materials

In Reading class, technology is a <u>tool for learning</u>, not for personal benefit; therefore, cell phones will be kept in a designated area of the room.

5. **Grades** are based on percentages for class work, quizzes, tests and class participation.

6. Make-up work:

- Assignments must be turned in on time, if you are present in class. Late assignments may receive less credit, unless an agreement is made between student and teacher.

Student "A" reads 20 minutes each day	Student "B" reads 5 minutes each day	Student "C" reads 1 minute each day	
3600 minutes in a school year	900 minutes in a school year	180 minutes in a school year	
1,800,000 words	282,000 words	8,000 words	
90 th percentile	50th percentile	10 th percentile
