<p>Example: Cinderella Mon 8/26</p>	<p>18-25</p>	<p>6 F. Cinderella is the main character of this story. Some of the conflicts she faced during the story was not being allowed to attend the Prince's Ball, having an evil Stepmother, and the death of her mother. Cinderella responds to these conflicts by being kind and hopeful. Her fairy godmother sends Cinderella to the Ball and eventually Cinderella and the Prince get married.</p>
