Rationale

Category #1: Merit

Rationale:

- SAT and ACT scores were based on general college admission requirements.

Category #2: Community Involvement

Rationale:

- Volunteerism demonstrates an individual's commitment to the betterment of his/her community.
- Employment history reflects the candidate's willingness to work and gain applicable life skills.
- Letters of recommendation validate the quality of work displayed by the individual while on the assignment.

Category #3: School Involvement

Rationale:

- Athletics promote and develop teamwork, leadership, character development and health & wellness.
- Performing arts develop and enrich personal creativity, dedication and confidence.
- Clubs provide students with opportunities to explore personal and professional interests.
- Leadership shows an individual's willingness to guide and serve others.

Category #4: Scholarship Essay

Rationale:

- The committee concluded that students should be able to compile an essay that addresses the topic between 300 500 words.
- The essay rubric will be developed by a committee comprised of secondary/post-secondary educators.

Letters of Recommendation

Student must submit one (1) and no more than three (3) letters of recommendation. At least one letter must be from an academic teacher. Letters of recommendation can be used to validate volunteer or employment experiences.

Category #3: School Involvement

Include in your resume details of your involvement in school, community, and faith-based activities including athletics, performing arts, and clubs. Include the years participated and any leadership positions held. If preferred, you may submit a resume including this information.

Category #4: Scholarship Essay

* Essay is mandatory for all scholarship candidates.

* The essay must be typed and at least 300-500 words in length.

* Include the essay with your application.
