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Hainesport Township School Excludable Conditions

CONJUNCTIVITIS (PINK EYE) - A student with reddened and/or crusting or draining eyes must stay out of school until condition clears or can return with a Doctor's note of clearance.

CHICKENPOX - Students may return to school when all lesions are dry and scabbed over. Doctor's note not required.

DIARRHEA - Any student with persistent loose stools should remain out of school until symptom free for at least 24 hours.

FEVER - Students with a temperature >100 degrees will be sent home from school and cannot return until they are fever free without fever-reducing medicine such as Tylenol or Motrin for a full 24 hours.

IMPETIGO - Must be seen by a Doctor and return with a note with Doctor's clearance. Lesions must be covered.

LICE - Students with live lice must stay out of school until treated. Prior to returning to school, students must be brought to school by their parents and have hair inspected by the school nurse before resuming classes and bus transportation.

NONCOMPLIANCE - Any student whose immunizations are not in compliance with New Jersey State Immunization Requirements will be excluded from school.

RASH - Students with a rash of unknown identity, involving more than one area of the body are to be excluded from school until the rash is cleared or a Doctor's note is obtained stating the child is not contagious and able to return to school.

RESPIRATORY EXUDATE - Students with copious nasal or throat drainage should stay home until symptoms resolve.

RINGWORM - Any student with ringworm must show evidence of current treatment & area must be covered in order to return to school.

SCABIES - Students will be excluded from school until a Doctor's note indicating treatment is completed and student is not contagious.

STREP - Student must remain home until he/she has been on antibiotic treatment for at least 24 hours. Doctor's note requested.

VOMITING - Any student who vomits in school will be sent home to recuperate and cannot return until symptom free for at least 24 hours.

WOUNDS - Students with an open wound that is moist or oozing and cannot be covered will be excluded from school until the wound is dry.
