## REFERENDUM BASICS

### What is an Operating Referendum?

- A levy referendum is an election in which voters can approve or disapprove an increase in the school district's revenue.
- The revenue can be used for anything.
- Different than a bond.
- Bonds are for Buildings Levy is for Learning.

## **Current Operating Levy**

- The current levy in place will expire June 30, 2020.
- This levy generates \$1,806,782 or \$176.88 per resident pupil unit for the 2019-2020 school year.
- When this expires, the district loses the levy authority to generate the additional money needed to operate.
- The School Board is asking to renew the levy authority for \$460.00 for ten years and include the inflationary factor language.

## How does the Operating Levy generate revenue?

- \$176.88 Per Pupil Unit
- X APU (Adjusted Pupil Units) 1,711.00 X Equalizing Factors = \$1,806,782 for 2019-2020.
- Levy = \$1,267,950 70% Based on APU
- State Aid = \$538,832 30% Based on RPU (Resident Pupil Units)
- This total amount includes Equity Revenue and Local Optional Revenue.

# What has changed since the last election in 2011? – Changes in Pupil Weighting

- Legislative Changes in 2013
- Changed the way the resident pupil units are weighed or counted. Which changed the amount of referendum allowance from \$727.36 to \$900.88.
   Effective for the 2014-2015 Fiscal Year.
- Maintained the same level of funding. There was no increase in revenue or taxes. Only the way the pupil units are counted.
- Adjusted Pupil Units APU

## What has changed since the last election in 2011? – Board Approved Authority

- In 2014 and 2019, the Legislators approved \$724.00
  in Local Optional Levy Authority for all districts in
  the State.
- The \$724.00 LOR then reduces the amount of voter approved levy authority.
- Reduces the GSL Levy Authority to \$176.88.

## What will happen to my Taxes?

- Will be a slight increase in Taxes.
- Operating levies or Referendum Revenue is spread on the Referendum Market Value of the District.
- Only One Rate Classification All property is taxed the same. Same value between residential, commercial, farm home. No Ag land.
- Inflationary factor beginning the second year.
- Inflationary rate is only applied to the \$460.00 amount.

The figures in the table are based on school district taxes for the referendum levy only, and do not include tax levies for other purposes. Tax increases shown above are gross increases, not including the impact of the Minnesota Homestead Credit Refund ("Circuit Breaker") program. Many owners of homestead property will qualify for a refund, based on their income and total property taxes. This will decrease the net effect of the referendum levy for many property owners.

NOTE: Agricultural property will pay taxes for the proposed referendum based only on the value of the house, garage and one acre. Seasonal recreational residential property (i.e., cabins) will pay no taxes for the proposed referendum.



## Is Agricultural Farmland Taxed?

- No. Legislative changes have exempted Ag land from being taxed as part of the Operating levy. Ag homestead taxes are based on the house, garage and one acre of land.
  - In addition, Ag land now receives an Ag credit on all school building bonds and abatement bonds that have been approved by the voters. In 2020, the tax credit will be 50% and by 2023 the credit will be 70%.
- Seasonal recreational property (cabins) are also exempt from the Referendum taxes.

## Length of Referendum

- 10 years.
- Referendums can be any length up to 10 years.
  - Cost of Election
  - Financial Planning
  - State Funding

#### School District Question Approval of School District Referendum Revenue Authorization

The proposed referendum revenue authorization would increase each year by the rate of inflation and be applicable for ten years, beginning with taxes payable in 2020 , unless otherwise revoked or reduced as provided by law.
