Summer School and Camp Descriptions

Summer School: Need to catch up on some of those credits so you can be on track to graduate or play sports? Want to get ahead so you can take some college classes your senior year or even possible graduate early? Well come join Mrs. Ross and Mrs. Cameron for summer school. Summer school is teacher facilitated, meaning we will be your guide, with onsite Credit Recovery and Course Acceleration using Odysseyware. Each session of Summer School is three weeks long and four days a week for four hours at a time. Students will complete one class at a time with the option to earn up to 2.0 credits within the six-week time frame.

3D Printing Camp: Are you interested in learning the basics of 3D printing? Working with Mr. McHaffie in the Shop, you will learn about all TinkerCad and walk away with your own designs each day!

Dungeons and Dragons (D & D) Camp: Epic battles. Wiley tricksters. Mysterious objects. Magic spells. Monsters and villains of every shape and size. Treasures beyond your wildest dreams. This is just a sampling of what you can expect to come across in a Dungeons and Dragons campaign. Camp will begin with a character-building session, where students will get to craft their own character to play in the campaign, complete with a backstory to help inform how their character will behave and interact with the rest of the group. Once

characters are built and ground rules established, the Dungeon Master will lead the group of adventurers through a series of missions, allowing them to gain experience and level up as they go. No experience necessary, you can learn as you go. We will be playing from the 3.5 edition because of its accessibility (all books can be found as pdfs online). Useful things to bring along if you have them would be some sort of device to access pdfs (phone, tablet, laptop), and a set of gamer's dice (includes one each of 20 sided (no spin downs!), 12 sided, 8 sided, 6 sided, and 4 sided, and two 10 sided die). If you don't have them, don't worry! There will be books and dice sets available to borrow during camp.

Adventure awaits. Will you answer the call?

Archeology Camp: Mr. James will be offering an introductory course in archeology and anthropology. learn how the Umpqua Indigenous tribe lived through hands on experiences. We will visit the Umpqua Band of Indians as well as the Douglas County Museum to speak with local tribal elders and see artifacts found locally. We will then visit Mr. James' family farm where Indigenous artifacts have been located and do our own archeological dig. See a working fruit tree farm.... play your cards right and you may get some fresh peaches straight from the tree.

Mythology Camp: This summer camp will focus on elements of Greek mythology and culture for a week of fun, filled with stories, acting, painting, drawing, athletics, and more. Each of the 4 days will prioritize a different subject, including: Mythology, The First Olympics, Theater and Culture, and War. Whether learning the names and powers of all the ancient gods, writing, and performing your own play, competing to become the best Olympic athlete, or showering your opponents with water balloons, this camp will be a blast.

Natural Resources Camp: Do you enjoy the outdoors, trees, fish and hiking then look no further than this summer's Natural Resources Summer Camp. Aimed at students going into 6th grade to 9th grade, this camp will be going to different areas in the Umpqua River basin to see nature and do activities. We will be hiking so good shoes and preferably pants will be required. And expect to have some fun, too! We'll be going to the burned area along the Umpqua, we might visit some archeological sites, measure some trees, and see some fish.
