Kevin's Handy Dandy Online Learning Jargon Cheat Sheet

You may have a lot of online teaching jargon and acronyms being thrown at you right now. Here's a very brief glossary:



LMS: learning management system (e.g., Canvas, Blackboard, Moodle, etc.)

aka **VLE:** virtual learning environment

synchronous learning: instruction occurring simultaneously (e.g., web conferencing, chat room sessions)

asynchronous learning: instruction occurring at different times (e.g., pre-recorded lectures available for students to view on their schedules; discussion board assignments spread over different days)

DL: distance learning

You may hear, "Contact your ODL," that is your Office of Distance Learning (name may differ per institution)

F2F: face-to-face (aka on-campus or residential learning)

LTI app: learning tool interoperability application (far too many to name all, but some common examples are Zoom, VoiceThreads, Kaltura, Khan Academy, Turnitin, Office 365, Google Drive, as well as those provided by textbook publishers. Availability depends on institutional subscription, not platform used.)
