Summer Ossignments for Rising Fifth Graders

Reading is a very important part of the experience at McAlpine Elementary School. Research shows that the frequency and continuity of reading a variety of texts increases fluency, builds vocabulary, and helps readers become better writers. Most importantly, we hope that each and every student will become a life-long pleasure reader. Summer is a time for recreational reading, for exploring new books, and for reading those that you never had time for during the busy school year. So go ahead, read voraciously this summer!

The books are available at any branch of the Public Library of Charlotte and Mecklenburg County, your students CMS <u>OneAccess</u> account, or you may purchase the books at most bookstores or through <u>smile.amazon.com</u> (proceeds go to our school if you link your account to 'PTA North Carolina Congress Mcalpine Elementary School PTSA').

Students: You will need to choose one novel to read from <u>each</u> assignment. Both of these assignments will be part of your first literacy grades in 5th grade. A copy of the assignment is also available on our website at <u>mcalpineelementaryschool.wearecms.com</u> and in the main office throughout the summer.

Assignment 1: On a separate sheet of paper, write a summary on the major accomplishments of your person you chose to read about. Include your name and the title of the book.

Assignment 2: Chose one of the novels to read below and fill out the attached graphic organizer.

Students must complete the assignments for the novels they chose, to be turned in to their Language Arts teacher by the due date of **September 13th**. This grade will be included in their first quarter PowerSchool grade book.

Math Concepts:

- ⇒ Practice place value of 1,000 to 0.01 (one hundredth)
- ⇒ Work on learning and memorizing multiplication and division facts up to 12.
- ⇒ Practice word problems that use multiplication and division facts.
- ⇒ Practice finding equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions, converting improper to mixed numbers (and vice versa) and adding and subtracting fractions with common denominators.
