Who's Ready to be a Sentinel?!




- Berkshire Middle School's mascot is The Sentinel!








Welcome To 6th Grade (almost)

- There's a lot to cover, so we're going to wait until the end for questions (they'll likely be covered in the presentation, anyway).




So... What's 6th Grade Like?

- Well, it's a LOT different from 5th grade!
- We'll take some time to discuss some of the most common details from the life of a middle schooler.
- But first, let's check out the scheduling process!



Your Scheduling Card

In order to build your schedule for next year, we need you and your folks at home to complete your scheduling card (your elementary school counselor will provide these).




First Things, First

 Neatly write your name (Last, First) on the top of your scheduling card, and circle your elementary school.




Required Core Courses

- Next year, you'll have 4 Core courses:
 - Integrated English 6 (Reading, Writing, & Language)
 - Social Studies 6
 - Science 6
 - Mathematics 6



Required Core Courses

- Next year, you'll have 4 Core courses:
 - Each of these courses is 53 minutes long.
 - Every 6th grader takes the same Core courses (but with different teachers).



Teams

- In middle school, students are assigned to teams of 3-4 teachers (one for each Core subject).
- Everyone on a team has the same 4 teachers (just in different periods).
- Most years, we have three 6th grade teams at Berkshire: Teams 601, 602, and 603.



Teams


- Students are randomly assigned to teams.
- You may have students from your elementary school on your team, but you'll also have students from the other 3 elementary schools that feed into Berkshire (Alum Creek, Cheshire, Johnnycake Corners, Walnut Creek).



What is Academic Assist?

- You'll also have another course in your schedule that all 6th graders will take (53 minutes, as well).
- It's labeled *Academic Assist* in PowerSchool, but we call it G.O. Time (Growth Opportunity Time).
- For this course, you'll be assigned to one of your team's teachers, but you probably won't go there every day.

- Students typically rotate through their Core teachers each day of the week for G.O. Time.
- You will not earn a grade in this course; teachers provide extension activities, enrichment, guided practice, and even invite guest speakers from time to time.
- Each team handles this course a little bit differently, so they'll have more to share with you the first week of school.

Unified Arts Courses



- Sixth grade students also have two periods for Unified Arts courses (Specials).
- For one of the periods, students will have a rotation of 6 different courses, each lasting 6 weeks.
- The other period will be a year-long, Elective course.
- These periods are also 53 minutes long.

Unified Arts Courses



- Every sixth grader will be required to take the 6-week Unified Arts courses listed to the right.
- The order in which you have them will be random (they're listed alphabetically, here).

- Academic Lab 6
- Digital Exploration 6
- Health 6
- Physical Education 6 (every 6th grade student takes this course twice)
- Visual Art 6


Elective Courses



- For the other Unified Arts period, students may choose to take either:
 - Study Hall 6 [OR]
 - Performing Arts (one or two of the following):
 - Band 6
 - Choir 6
 - Strings 6

Unified Arts Courses

• Elective courses:



- If you select Study Hall, you will not take a Performing Arts course (Music).
- If you select Performing Arts, you may choose one OR two of the options.
- If you do take two Performing Arts courses, you will alternate days. You'll have Performing Arts every day, but will have one of them one day, and the other the next.

Unified Arts Courses

- If you'd like to take a Performing Arts course, you do NOT need to have taken any in elementary school.
- However, your future Performing Arts teacher will need some information to prepare you for next year.

*If signing up for Band and/or Strings, an instrument selection process is required. This will take place in April. Please do not obtain an instrument without further instruction. Register for the course now, and list parent/guardian contact information below for further communications:

What Is a Typical Day Like?

- School begins at 7.40, and ends at 2.45.
- Classes are 53 minutes long (extra time in last period for announcements).
- Students travel from class to class.

Lunch

- All 6th graders eat lunch together (11.24-11.54) in our cafeteria.
- You can typically sit where you like at lunch (seats are not usually assigned).
- You may bring your lunch from home, or...



Lunch

- You may purchase your lunch.
- If you decide to purchase your lunch, you'll find your seat, and then wait for the cafeteria monitors to call you to the lunch line (to avoid over-crowding).
- *A standard lunch (daily special) costs \$2.75.



Lunch

• The cafeteria is much larger than what you have in your elementary school, and has a greater variety of offerings, should you choose to purchase your lunch (a la carte items, sandwiches, salads, daily special offerings, etc.).



What about Recess?

• Unfortunately, middle school students do not have recess, but you'll be moving around the building throughout the day, so you'll certainly get a chance to burn off some energy!



What's the Building Like?

- Each grade's Core classrooms are grouped into grade-level houses.
- This means that all 6th graders are in the same hallway for most of the day, and will not mingle with 7th or 8th graders.



What's the Building Like?

• Unified Arts classes are in their own areas of the building, but are fairly easy to locate, as well (most are in the main hallway).

Lockers

- Lockers are usually assigned in the hallway where a student's first class is located.
- Because lockers are assigned, students do not carry backpacks during the school day.



Is Berkshire Crowded?

• As of 01/05/2024, we have 875 students in our building, with roughly 325 6th Graders



Homework

- Some incoming middle school students wonder if they will have a lot of homework.
- The short answer is YES.
- Middle school is more rigorous than elementary, but if you maintain good study skills, you should have no problem being successful!




Homework

- Teachers post assignments and upcoming assessments to Schoology.
- Sixth graders also receive an agenda book / planner. Students are encouraged to use these planners to keep track of their assignments throughout the year.



Do I Need a Laptop or Chromebook?

- If you have a laptop or Chromebook, you can definitely bring it to use for your classes. Your teachers will let you know when you need them.
- If you don't have a laptop or Chromebook, there's no need to worry! We have plenty at Berkshire for you to use!



Behavioral Expectations

- Berkshire Middle School is located on 3 Bs & K Road...
- This makes our behavioral expectations easy to remember!
- If you're wondering if you're on the right track, think of the 3 Bs & K Way!



Can I Bring My Phone?

- Some 6th graders have phones and wonder whether or not they can use them at school.
- Usually, teachers do not allow phones in the classroom, so students will need to keep them in their locker throughout the day.
- Phones may be used during Lunch.



Does Berkshire Have a Dress Code?

- The dress code at Berkshire is similar to elementary school.
- Some points to note:
 - Hats are typically not permitted;
 - Flip flops should not be worn to school (for safety);
 - No profanity or inappropriate content;
 - Clothing should be modest (shouldn't show too much skin).



Can 6th Graders Have Detention?

- Sometimes, yes.
- However, there are different types of detention: after-school, and lunch detention.
- Usually, students will meet with one of our principals (Ms. Baker, Mrs. Nagel, or Mr. Bidlack) to resolve the discipline issue without the need for a detention.

Extracurricular Activities
