- All students must complete a sequential elective.
 - Example: Art 1 + Art 2
 - Vet Tech Class = Vet Tech 1 & Vet Tech 2

College or Career Ready

- Students need either an AS, AP, Dual Enrollment Course OR a CTE Credential + CTE Completer
 - W!SE test in Economics and Personal Finance
 - BTEC credential

Reminder!

Advanced Studies Diploma does NOT require a student to take Advanced Classes.

The only exception is World History 2 AS.

Registration Process

- October 21 Parent Meetings
- November 25 CAMS Tours JRHS
- December 3-5** Current 8th graders complete registration with JRHS Counselors at CAMS



Changes to course requests must be made by June 1, 2025.

Enrollment and Schedule Changes

- Classes will only be offered if a significant number of students enroll
- Schedule changes must be completed by the Friday of the first full week of classes.
 - Schedule change request form is electronic.
 - Will be posted on the JRHS counseling page and main JRHS page.
- Second Semester schedule changes should be made by October 15.
- Schedules will not be completed until August.


Science Pathway




If a student getting an Advanced Diploma takes Biology AS in 9th grade, they will need to take both Chemistry and Physics before they graduate.

Dual Enrollment – Off Campus

- Students will take care of their own registration at the community college.
 - There may be a form that needs a counselor signature to enroll.
- Students will need to apply and qualify the community college system.
- Courses may be in person or virtual
- Pay 100% tuition to the college
- Course must be able to be used toward a degree or certificate
- Students will need to show their counselor verification of enrollment

ELIGIBILITY

- Students should be a high school aged junior or senior
- Must have a 3.0 HS GPA
- Must have completed Algebra I with a "C" or higher

HOW TO APPLY

- Apply to VWCC
- Complete the on-line Academy application
- Teacher recommendation form
- Community leader form
- Under 18 Parent Signature Form
- Copy of the HS transcript

About the Regional Academy

Classes take place at Virginia Western

- Taught by Virginia Western Faculty
- May be in-person or on-line (check your schedule)
- You will need a computer that meets the VWCC standards
- You will use CANVAS as a means to communicate with your instructor, upload assignments, etc.

Monday through Friday

- 8:00 a.m. 10:45 a.m.
- Student transportaition unless provided by the high school
- VWCC Academic Calendar (Different than the high school calendar)

TUITION and Books

- Students are responsible for tuition, textbook
- Program may have special computer requirements

Funding for the Regional Academy

Dual Enrollment Students do not qualify for traditional college financial aid

- State appropriation for Health-Related Occupations. This is year-to-year with no guarantee of renewal
- Must Apply, Maintain a 2.5 GPA, take all classes in the sequence, be sincerely interested in a health professions related programs (see website for complete details)
- NOT ALL CLASSES are covered




