# Tips & Tricks

#### **Lockers**

Opening a locker takes practice and patience. Get a combination lock and practice over the summer!

#### **Color Code**

Keep class materials easily organized by using one color per class. For example: have a BLUE Science notebook and a BLUE Science binder.

#### **Make a Routine**

Create a schedule for your home and stick to it! For example, coming home from school, eating a snack, doing homework at the table, packing backpack (s) the night before, getting to bed by a certain time, etc.

#### Ask for Help

Our students aren't supposed to know everything yet. Teachers are here to help- just ask!

# **Adolescent Development**

#### **Significant Developmental Changes:**

- There are rapid physical growth and hormonal changes
- Most dynamic brain development between 6th 8th grade

(this is the greatest period of brain changes second only to infancy - two years of age)

#### **Age- Appropriate Behavior:**

- Increasing influence of peer relationships
- Tend to provide less information to us as parents; believe they don't need help
- This age group is becoming more self aware. They question: Who am I? What can I become? There are feelings of vulnerability and a strong desire to be accepted

# **Parental Tips**

Best ways to support your child through this transition:

- Keep a positive attitude about Middle School
- Encourage your child to get involved
- When speaking with your child, normalize their feelings (Remind them that many of their peers will be experiencing similar concerns)
- Acknowledge and validate their feelings, this can help diffuse big emotions
- Assist in silencing their inner critic. (Assist them in changing their mindset. Mistakes are a chance to learn)
- Keep the lines of communication open- active listening
- Encourage self advocacy: we all need help at some point in our lives
- Maintain family traditions, especially family dinners (These rituals add to their sense of belonging and security)
- Encourage exercise, sleep, healthy food choices, model relaxation through mindfulness, deep breathing and yoga

Strong support from parents and educators will help students develop the confidence they need to make healthy choices. We all do better together.

<u>Math 6</u> is an on-grade level Sixth Grade Mathematics course that utilizes the Ready Math Curriculum and is aligned to the 6th grade NJ Student Learning Standards. Problem solving and critical thinking skills will be emphasized throughout the course. The course content will include, but is not limited to:

- Decimals and Properties of Operations
- Number Theory
- Expressions and Equations
- Fractions
- Ratios, Percents, and Proportions
- Integers and Rational Numbers
- Coordinate Plane
- Geometry and Measurement
- Data and Graphs
- Statistics

<u>Pre Algebra</u> is a 6th and 7th grade mathematics course that utilizes the enVision Mathematics Curriculum and is aligned to the 7th and 8th grade NJ Student Learning Standards. Problem solving and critical thinking skills will be emphasized throughout the course. The course content will include, but is not limited to:

- Rational Number Operations
- Real Numbers
- Proportional Relationships (equations, graphing, percents)
- Equivalent Expressions
- Solve Problems Using Equations and Inequalities
- Analyze and Solve Linear Equations
- Pythagorean Theorem
- Sampling to Draw Inferences About Populations
- Probability
- Geometry

#### **Social Studies:**

Have you ever wondered why the Egyptians mummified their dead? How writing systems developed around the globe? Why was farming such an important advancement for humans? Or what caused the Harappan civilization to disappear from the Indus River Valley?

6th grade Social Studies is an introduction to ancient civilizations, emphasizing student understanding that in order to succeed as a civilization, certain elements must be present. Students are investigators of the past, exploring artifacts, people, and events to develop their skills as historians in their thinking and writing. Students will be challenged to evaluate key aspects of civilizations, drawing conclusions about the successes and failures of empires, all while making meaningful connections to the issues that face people today.

#### **ELA:**

In 6th grade ELA, students will work to develop crucial life skills in the areas of reading, writing, speaking, and listening. Our students will explore many genres of text, such as novels, short stories, poetry, and nonfiction through a combination of class novels, book clubs, and choice independent reading. They will also practice the writing process through various genres of writing, including narratives, informational essays, persuasive pieces, free writes, and poetry. Finally, sixth graders will acquire new grammar skills as well as learn vocabulary words and patterns through our "Weekly Words" program. In addition to content, sixth graders will grow their executive functioning skills as they transition from an elementary to a middle school model.

#### **Science:**

Sixth grade science is geared toward enhancing students' knowledge about all the wonders of the world. We will be using scientific practices to gather evidence that will help us discover how science contributes and explains phenomena of the world and from our everyday lives! Science topics in chemistry, physics, earth science and life science are covered during the school year. We emphasize building skills in being a self-directed and accountable learner, gathering evidence and using resources to solve problems, and how to effectively collaborate and communicate solutions.

When focusing on progress over perfection, mistakes are expected and encouraged. Learning from those mistakes and how to use different strategies to improve is a key component of the scientific process and the transition to 6th grade.

Medical notes, communication, Genesis input


Consequences given if attendance issues arise
