Roseburg is located in the Land of the Umpqua, featuring the "hundred valleys" of the Umpqua River watershed and the associated scenic byway. The year-round mild climate produces scenic beauty and wonderful recreation opportunities. In addition, Roseburg is the gateway to the northern entrance of Crater Lake National Park.



Roseburg is a historic logging town that has become a desired destination for tourists, families and retirees. The city boasts a strong visual and performing arts scene that includes the annual Music on the Half Shell event featuring internationally known musicians as well as an annual arts festival. A variety of dining options, breweries and retail shops attract locals and visitors alike, while a vibrant year-long farmers market highlights the abundance of the Umpqua Valley.

Climb a mountain, raft a river, catch a salmon or hike to cascading waterfalls (there are more than 80!) through lush forests. In just over an hour, you can be at the Coast, the lake, or the mountains. Tour local award-winning vineyards and wineries, drive through nearby Wildlife Safari – a vast reserve featuring hundreds of wild animals – or simply grab a coffee at a downtown cafe and enjoy the small-town charm.

About Our District

Roseburg Public Schools is comprised of 13 school campuses throughout the community. The district includes one comprehensive four-year high school, two middle schools for grades 6-8, eight elementary schools serving students in grades K-5 and one comprehensive virtual school serving K-5. In addition, the district sponsors an independent charter school.



The district currently serves over 5,600 students with an operating budget of \$142 million. The district currently employs over 380 licensed staff. Average class sizes for the 2021-22 school year are:

Grade 1:	23 students
Grade 2:	21 students
Grade 3:	22 students
Grade 4:	24 students
Grade 5:	20 students
