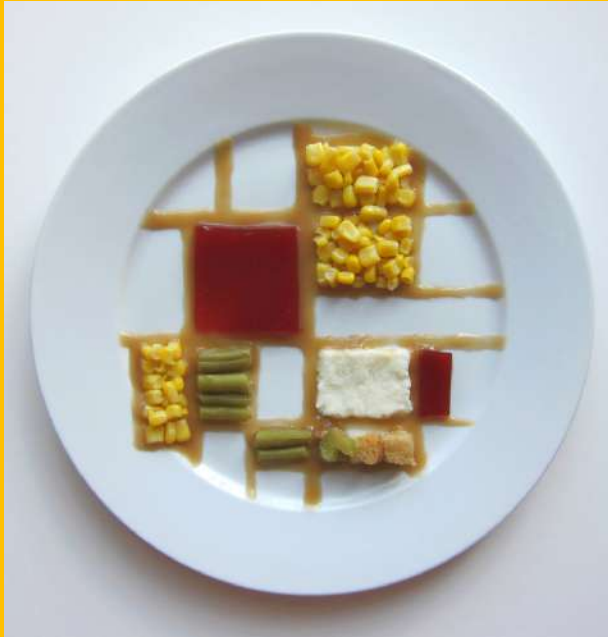

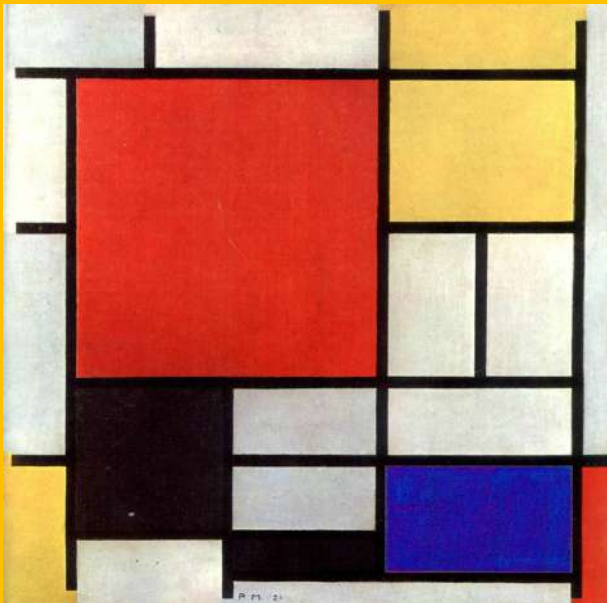
Piet Mondrian



Mondrian evolved a non-representational form which he termed neoplasticism.

This consisted of white ground, upon which was painted a grid of vertical and horizontal black lines and the three primary colors.

He felt that using primary and neutral colors allowed him to paint only the basics of life. He wished to paint the foundation of all things.

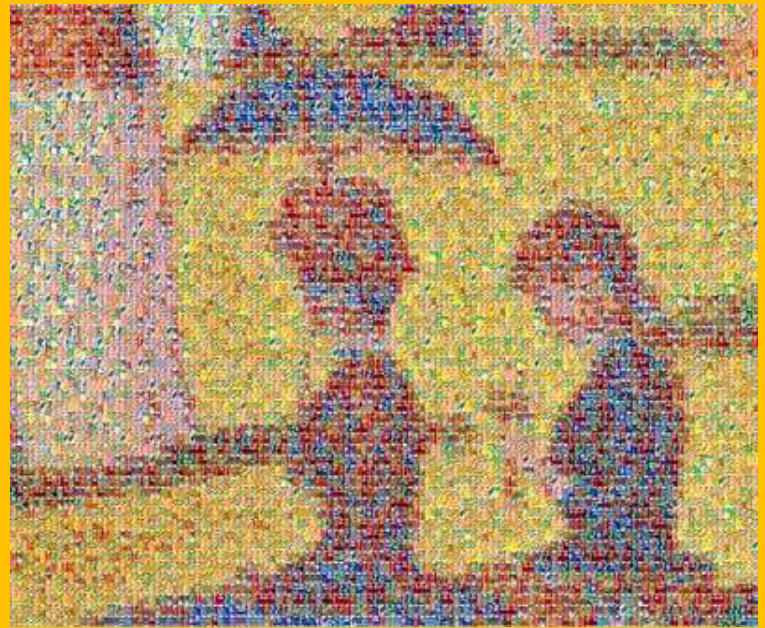

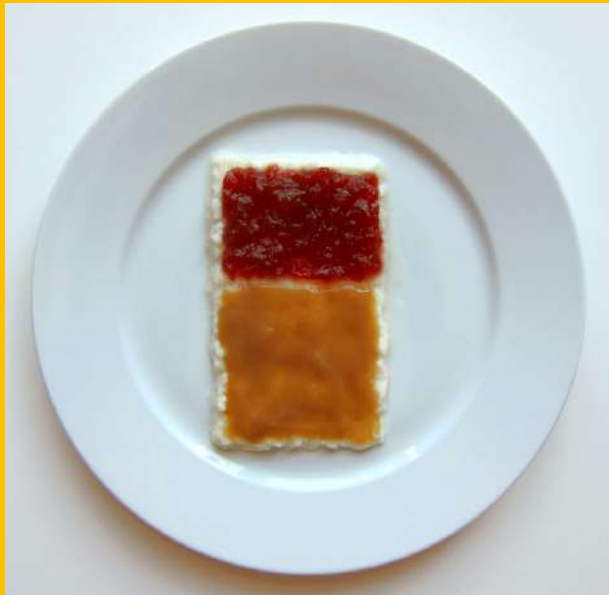
Georges Seurat

Georges Seurat is best known for developing a technique known as pointillism.

Images were created by grouping dabs of complementary colors next to each other.

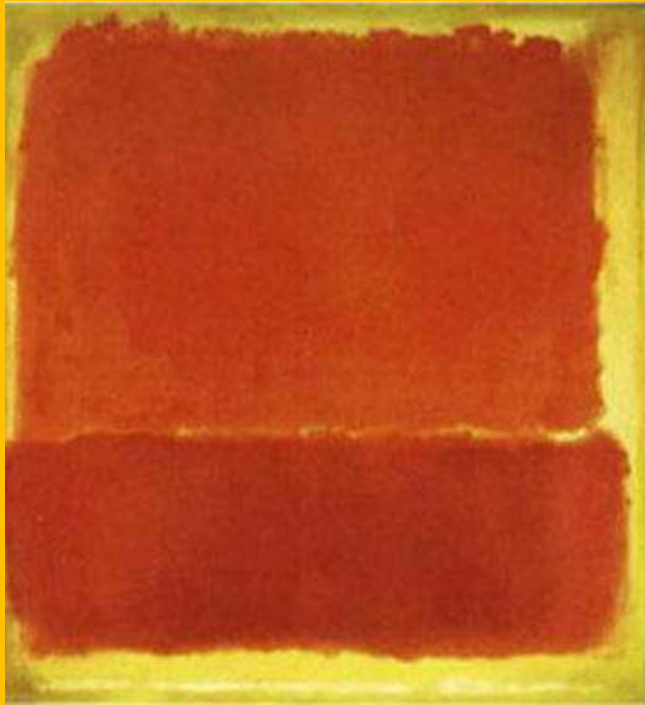
Mark Rothko

Mark Rothko was a Russian artist who moved to America.

He is most famous for his “Color Field” paintings.

His style used colors that complement each other in rectangles.

Both colors are noticeable and look as if they are floating.

Julian Schnabel

Julian Schnabel is best known for his plate paintings.

He claims that he is trying to create beauty out of brutality. The broken plates represent anger and rage.

Rene Magritte

Rene Magritte was a Belgian Surrealist artist.

His work focused on dream life subject matter.

He created a series of "Ceci n'est pas..." paintings. This translates to "This is not..." He meant has no matter how realistic an image is, it is not the object itself, "...it does not satisfy emotionally"

Andy Warhol



Andy Warhol made a variety of art works but he is best known for his silk screened images. His art was considered POP art which is inspired by popular

He was able to recreate the same image multiple times but he would change colors with each square.

Pablo Picasso
