- Receive course cards today
- Course content review
 - February 8th and 9th: Elective offerings in Community Period
 - February 10th: Core subject elective offerings in Community Period
- From Feb. 8 Feb. 14, teachers will recommend core courses in Synergy.
- Students will enter electives and alternate electives in StudentVUE during English
 - Current 9th and 10th graders February 15th and 16th
 - Current 11th graders February 22nd and 23rd
- Electives must be entered using StudentVUE (not ParentVUE)

Course Verification

- Verifications will be available in ParentVUE approximately March 17th
 - This is the student's opportunity to change/correct courses
 - o If changes are requested, print, sign and return to the counseling office by Friday March 24th
