Australia is famous for having unusual wild animals!



Kangaroos

What do you want to be famous for? Why?

- These wild animals include the kangaroo and koala, but Australia has other unusual animals too.
- Most of the animals live in the wilderness of Australia.
- The unusual animals of Australia include birds like the kookaburra and cassowary.
- They include other animals like the bilby, dingo and echidna.





A kookaburra makes a sound like it is laughing!

- A kookaburra is a small gray and brown bird with a long beak.
- Kookaburras live in trees in the forests of Australia.
- A kookaburra uses its strong eyesight and large, powerful beak to hunt for food.
- A kookaburra makes a sound like a person laughing. This sound scares other birds away.

A cassowary is a large bird that cannot fly!

- A cassowary has black feathers on its body. The bird's neck and head are very colorful.
- The cassowary lives in the rainforests of Australia.
- Cassowaries have long legs and sharp claws. If a cassowary is scared, it kicks with its claws.
- They have coverings on their heads that look like helmets.











A bilby is a small animal that looks like a rabbit!

- A bilby has a long snout. It has blue, gray and white fur and long ears.
- Bilbies live in deserts across Australia.
- They eat parts of plants, such as grass and fruit. They eat small insects and worms, too.
- Bilbies often dig holes and climb into them. This protects bilbies from heat and from other animals.

A dingo is a wild dog that cannot bark!



A Dingo

Would you want a dingo for a pet? Why?

- A dingo looks like a dog, but it howls like a wolf! It has a longer snout and bigger ears than a dog.
- Dingoes either live alone or in groups in the wilderness.
- They hunt for small animals, such as rodents and lizards. They eat fruit and vegetables too.
- Dingoes can run very fast and can jump very high in the air.





An echidna has a spiky coat to protect itself!

- An echidna looks like a porcupine or a hedgehog. It has sharp spines all over its body.
- When they are scared, echidnas can roll into small balls to protect themselves.
- Echidnas use their long, sticky tongues to catch and eat insects.
- An echidna is one of the many unusual animals from Australia!












What do echidnas have on their bodies?
