Understanding Sequencing

Instructions

For this assignment, you went out on **September 4** to create an action sequence with 20 shots. You need to do an action within 20 feet, filming 20 **UNIQUE** shots of the action. Make sure you film **HORIZONTALLY** for this film. You needed to use the entire time that we were out around campus.

Extra Credit

For this assignment, you will get extra credit if you keep the film to 30 seconds or shorter.

- *Potential 25 points extra credit.*

File Management

Create a project folder on your desktop named **240904 Action in 20**. This is where we will keep everything for this project in. Make the following folders within the project folder:

- **B-Roll** (*This is where you put all of your video clips from your phone once you move it to your computer*)
- **Project Folder** (*This is where you will choose as your destination when you create a new project in Premiere Pro*)
- **Audio** (*This is where you will put your song's audio file in*)

Editing to the Music

You will download a Royalty Free song and edit to the beat of the song for the action. Try looking for something fast beat if you're trying to get the video to 30 seconds or under.

Royalty Free Music

There is a page on the Class Website that has a list of Royalty Free music you can download from. No copyrighted music is allowed.

Premiere Pro

- Use the YouTube video that Mr. Nistas provided on how to upload, edit, and then export your video.
- Use the **Premiere Pro Quick Start** guide on the Class Website under Premiere Pro for an explanation on the different tools and step by step instructions for how to export.

Creativity

CREATIVITY is key with all films. Try being creative with your films, eventually it will play a part in your grade.

Helpful Tips

- Film the action in one shot first, so both you and your subject know what's going to happen. Then think of **EVERYTHING** you could possibly film for it. Think of **ALL** the different angles you can be at!
- Create a unique album specifically for this assignment that all of your film clips will be in.
- Repeat the action! If you have the subject do the action over and over again while you change up your location/angle to film, it makes it a lot easier to edit the video together.

How to move files from your phone to the computer


To send a photo or video to yourself from your phone to the classroom computer, you can do the following:

- If you have an iPhone, you can **AIRDROP** it to your computer.
 - Click and hold on the picture/video on your phone, then go to *SHARE* and then click AirDrop.
 - Look at the number at the base of your computer and select that on your phone to AirDrop it.
 - You will see a notification at the top right of your computer screen, and select to save it to your Downloads folder.
- If you don't have an iPhone or don't want to use AirDrop, you can **EMAIL** the photo/video to yourself(*Highly recommended to use your school email with @FWUSD8.org*).
 - On your phone, use either an email app or go onto your email through the website.
 - Attach the photo/video to the email and then send it to yourself.
 - On your computer, go to your email and download the photo.

Once your photo is downloaded to your Download folder, go to the following section.

How to upload photos/files to Google Classroom

Make sure you emailed/airdropped/etc your files to your computer before you start:

1. On the assignment, on the right side click **+ Add or create**.
2. Click on  **File**.
3. Click **Browse**(*You can also drag and drop the file onto the web browser*).
4. Find your image(*by default it will be in the Downloads folder, otherwise find it where you saved it*). Click **Open**.
5. When finished, click **Mark as done**.
 - a. If you need to change, remove, or upload new files, you just need to **Unsubmit** the assignment. When you’ve made your changes, make sure to resubmit by clicking **Mark as done**.

Do **NOT** put your files on Google Docs, Slides, etc. The video files need to be turned as video files.
