JV Washam Profile

The faculty at JV Washam is comprised of 48 classroom teachers, 4 full time and 3 half time special area teachers (Art, Music, PE, Technology, Media), 2 academic facilitators, a media assistant and 15 teacher assistants. The administrative team is comprised of one Principal, one Assistant Principal, one Dean of Students, and four office secretaries. Additionally, we have one TD teacher, one EC facilitator, three EC classroom teachers and one Guidance Counselor. We share a half time School Psychologist with another CMS School. The new principal began at JV Washam during March of 2013. The 2013-2014 school year will be her first full year of leadership.

Our student population consists of 1,072 students in grades K-5. All grade level homerooms are self contained except for fifth grade which team teaches by subject specialty in six of the seven classes. The seventh class is a self contained TD class and the teacher teaches all subjects. Breakdown by ethnicities include 833 White, 98 African American, 39 Asian, 79 Hispanic, and 23 Multi-Racial.

At JV Washam 100% of our staff are fully licensed, with 12 staff members having National Board Certification, 25 with advanced degrees, and average of 11 years of teaching experience. This year we have also added approximately 16 new staff members due to growth, retirement, life decisions to stay home with family and natural attrition through moving and leaving the state.

EOG data from the 2012-13 school year showed JV Washam did not meet growth in the areas of Math, Science and Reading. Our overall school proficiency was 59.4%. Science is an area of concern for our fifth graders as only 37.4% of students showed proficiency.

JV Washam Elementary is supported by involved parents and a supportive school community. Our school is based on strong PTO involvement and a newly established School Leadership Team. As we begin our 8th year of service to the Cornelius/Huntersville community, we currently have approximately 1,072 students living in the Cornelius and Huntersville areas that attend JV Washam for the 2013-14 school year.
