A fresh approach to green living

South Meck students build farm-to-table greenhouse

Approximately 75 freshmen from South Mecklenburg High School will revitalize its school's greenhouse. On Friday, Sept. 27, students will work alongside JE Dunn Construction in the first phase of a yearlong project building a sustainable farm-to-table greenhouse. Together, with CMS volunteers, they will frame walls, grout block and pull weeds as part of [Green Apple Day of Service](#). The project begins at 7:30 a.m. and activities will continue through 4 p.m.

The students who are in the school's Innovation, Design, Engineering and Art (IDEA) Academy will participate in the project. The IDEA Academy focuses on a new paradigm for education that promotes learning as a collaborative and cohesive process. Once the greenhouse is built, the project won't end. Students will participate in all phases of the project and learn about electric and irrigation systems, what to grow and how best to involve the community.

"The goal is to create a cross-curricular program through which students can grow organic food that can be used at the school," said project coordinator Brittany Stone, an English teacher at South Meck. "In a broader sense, students will also be able to practice principles of design and critical thinking, and develop skills in major curriculum areas."

The IDEA Academy has gained local attention in the community. Students won't just give back, but gain plenty along the way. Partnerships with the Civic & Cultural Arts Center of Pineville, the Bechtler Museum of Modern Art, UNC Charlotte College of Arts + Architecture and JE Dunn are providing learning opportunities for students and community investments.

Other activities scheduled for Sept. 27, include team-building tasks, upcycling and natural science lessons.

Bond Highlights

At Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, we strive to provide our students, families and community with high-quality schools that inspire learning and prepare students for success in college and the 21st-century workplace. On Nov. 5, Mecklenburg County residents will vote on a \$290 million bond referendum for CMS. The 17 projects in the bond request address CMS' highest-need capital projects and deliver three significant benefits.



1 *More academic options for students*

Many projects will increase access to high-demand programs and magnets that prepare today's students for tomorrow's workforce

- Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM)
- Language Immersion
- Career and Technical Education programs



2 *Relieve overcrowding*

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: *What is a bond and how is it used?*

A: A bond is a way for governments to borrow money at low interest rates to finance capital projects.

Mecklenburg County would sell bonds to fund new school construction, repairs and renovations for CMS facilities. The Mecklenburg County Board of Commissioners decides how much bond funding CMS can request in a bond referendum. Voters approve or reject the bonds.

Q: *Will my taxes increase if the bond referendum passes?*

A: No. There will be no tax increase related to the bond vote.

Q: *How were the 2013 school bond projects chosen?*

A: CMS staff considered a range of factors including school capacity, facility condition indices, the type of project (such as a new school or renovation) and health and safety impacts. These factors were put into a matrix which ultimately awarded each project a priority score. The entire list of capital needs was then ranked by score. The 17 highest-scoring projects are included in this bond request.

Q: *Will the 2013 bond request cover all CMS construction and renovation needs?*

A: No. The 2013 bond request will only cover 17 of the district's most pressing capital projects. The \$290 million request is only part of the district's \$1.8 billion 10-year capital need.

Q: *Why is the bond request for \$290 million when the total projected cost of the 17 CMS projects is \$295.2 million?*

A: The Mecklenburg County Board of Commissioners decides how much bond funding CMS can request in a bond referendum. The BOCC authorized a \$290 million bond to be placed on the November ballot. The additional \$5.2 million will be covered by Mecklenburg County using other funding sources.

Q: *How is bond money reported in the CMS budget?*

A: CMS has two budgets – an operating budget and a capital budget. The annual operating budget pays for the day-to-day expenses of running the district, such as salaries and benefits, textbooks and transportation. The capital budget pays for the design and construction of new schools and the renovation and replacement of existing schools to meet education standards.

Once bonds are approved and sold, the money is reported in the CMS capital budget.

Q: Can bond money be used to pay teacher salaries or other operating expenses?

A: No. Bond funds can only be used for capital projects

Q: Has CMS been a good steward of prior bond funds?

A: Yes. All completed CMS capital projects have been delivered on time and on- or under-budget.

To date, 2007 bond project efficiencies have yielded \$40 million in savings versus the planned budget.

Q: I don't have children in CMS. Why should I be concerned about the bond request?

A: Strong public education is critical for everyone in our community. Good schools provide a well-educated workforce to attract and retain business and industry. This supports a vibrant community and economy.

Q: When is the General Election and bond vote ?

A: The general election is Nov. 5.

Q: When is the deadline to register?

A: The deadline to register for the Nov. 5 election is Oct. 11.

Q: Can I vote early?

A: Yes. Early voting starts Oct. 24 and ends on Nov. 2.

Q: How can I register to vote?

A: Pick up a form at any Charlotte-Mecklenburg public library or at the Board of Elections office (741 Kenilworth Ave., Suite 202). You can also visit the Board of Elections' website at www.meckboe.org to download a copy of the registration application. Call the Board of Elections at 704-336-2133 if you have questions.

TESTING NEWS

PSAT

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) is a program co-sponsored by the College Board and [National Merit Scholarship Corporation \(NMSC\)](#). It's a standardized test that provides firsthand practice for the SAT®. It also gives you a chance to enter NMSC scholarship programs and gain access to college and career planning tools.

The PSAT/NMSQT measures: Critical reading skills Math problem-solving skills Writing skills

All 10th and 11th graders in CMS will take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 16th. Seniors and Freshmen will report to homeroom for academic activities. For additional information regarding the PSAT program or testing students with disabilities, please refer to the [PSAT Homepage](#). Students with an IEP or 504/LEP plan will not automatically receive their accommodations. Since this is a national test, College Board must grant approval for any test accommodations. Please note that the review process takes approximately seven weeks from the date of receipt of the **complete** documentation.

PLAN (State Administration)

All public school students in grade 10 will participate in PLAN. This is considered a state test. There is no test fee or need to register online. South Meck has ordered test materials for the 10th graders.

The 10th graders at South Meck will be taking the PLAN on **October 23rd** with their homeroom teachers. Students need to bring several #2 sharpened pencils. Students also have the option to bring a 4-function, graphing, or scientific calculator. But, all the math problems on the PLAN can be solved without a calculator. Prohibited calculators include the TI-89 and TI-92. The school will not provide calculators. Students are not allowed to have their cell phones or any other form of electronic communication on their person. If you have questions or concerns, please contact our Testing Coordinator, Elaine Miller.

The PLAN program has been designed to be administered within a half day during school-supervised sessions. It takes about 3 hours and 15 minutes to complete the entire program: approximately 60–70 minutes for the non-test sections and 2 hours and 10 minutes for the four tests of educational development. Tenth graders will take the PLAN with their homeroom teacher.

Because this is considered a State Administration, students with IEP's or 504 plans will follow their state allowed accommodations. If you have any questions regarding testing accommodations, please contact Elaine Miller at 980-343-3600.

Calculators** - Students are allowed to use calculators on the test. However, calculators are not required - all problems can be solved without a calculator. South Meck will not be providing students with calculators.

Students who are not taking the plan (9th, 11th, and 12th grade) will report to their homeroom upon arrival at school.

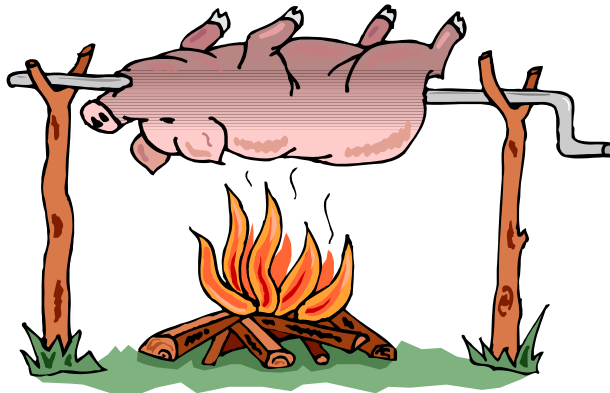
