Student Opportunities At North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics (NCSSM)

NCSSM is a public, residential high school for academically talented juniors and seniors, offering tomorrow's scientific and technological leaders the opportunity to live in a community with others of similar intellect, interests, and aspirations. Students study science, math, engineering, and humanities under a core faculty. You have to be a NC resident (as of December 1st) to be eligible for consideration.

Students apply during their sophomore year of high school. Criteria used to select students for admission are as follows:

- Interest in science/math/technology as determined by participation in clubs, competitions, supplemental programs, etc.
- Leadership positions held
- Above average grades in freshman and sophomore classes
- Enrollment in accelerated and challenging courses
- Teacher and Guidance Counselor evaluations
- Test results from SAT (must be taken Oct, Nov, Dec, or Jan of sophomore year)
- A NCSSM math test

Amazing Summer Opportunity For South Meck Students

Summer Ventures in Science and Math (SVSM) is a four-week, cost-free, residential summer program that is state-wide. It provides an opportunity for students to foster identified interests in science and math. Students learn experimental design laboratory skills, instrumentation mathematical modeling, strategies in mathematical problem solving and more, while engaged in specific scientific and mathematical topics of interest to them. CFNC Sends Electronic Transcripts To Most North Carolina Colleges

If you are applying to any North Carolina college or university, you can send your transcripts electronically through CFNC, even if you have applied through the colleges' individual websites. This saves both you and South Meck time and money!

Students can send transcripts electronically via CFNC.org through an exclusive agreement with the NC Department of Public Instruction. Students can securely send official high school transcripts (current and final) from all schools that have converted to NCWISE. Official electronic high school transcripts can be requested by the student in two ways:

1. After submitting an online application to any of the 110 colleges or universities in North Carolina.
2. Directly from CFNC.org's Transcript Manager. All 110 institutions in NC accept the electronic high school transcript in addition to the application for admission from CFNC.org.

In order to send electronic transcripts via CFNC.org, the student must meet the following criteria:

- Be currently enrolled or have graduated from a participating public high school in NC
- Have correctly entered the following information in the Profile and/or online admissions application:
 1. First and Name
 2. CMS Student ID
 3. Date of Birth
 4. Gender
 5. Current High School
 6. E-mail address

Please note the following:

- A successfully requested transcript should be received by the college within 1-3 business days
- Colleges/Universities may take up to 3 weeks to process before they are officially recorded as received.
