- 3. Email CMS and Board members expressing your thoughts about removing the Magnet from South Meck.
- 4. Review the materials

Currently, undocumented students are required to pay out of state tuition prices at NC colleges and universities, limiting who has the opportunity to attend them because of the cost. Student leaders at Our Turn have been meeting with politicians and leaders in the education field to ensure everyone has fair access to affordable college.
