## Dear 5<sup>th</sup> Graders,

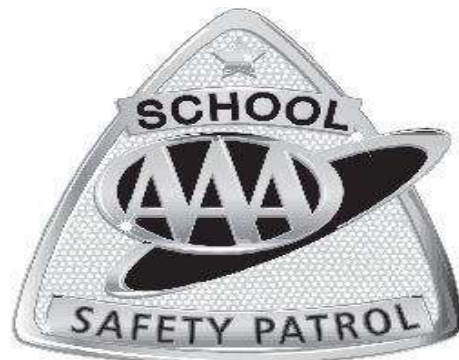
You have been such a great help this year. Several of you have been a great help to your teachers and amazing role models. You have been well behaved this year. I appreciate your cooperation.
