- What is Title I?
 - Title I is a federal program that gives schools additional funds to help students who are struggling in reading and math.
 - We are a Schoolwide Title I School, which means all students are included.
- Program design
 - We use HMH reading and writing curriculum in Reynolds School District. In mathematics, we use Curriculum Associates: iReady math curriculum. Both programs teach the common core standards at each grade level.
 - We use Acadience K-5th for reading benchmarking and progress monitoring, iReady benchmarking in mathematics, and OSAS, grades 3rd- 5th grade in reading, writing, and mathematics, as well we use the ELPA (English Language Proficiency Assessment) for our Multilanguage learners. These will measure student growth in the designated subject areas. Families will be informed of results at conferences and at the end of the year, for yearly growth
 - Information on the proficiency levels students are expected to meet
- Parent's Rights
 - Right to request teacher qualifications
 - You can request to see the qualifications of your child's teacher
 - Right to request to meet regularly with staff
 - We encourage you to request time to meet with your child's teachers whenever you need to. (how to do this...)

- Right to participate in decisions affecting your child
 - You are your child's first teacher. We respect and appreciate your partnership in helping your child learn and succeed.
- Right to review the school's Title I Plan and make suggestions
 - Our School Improvement Plan is posted on our district website, and you can request to look at it and make suggestions.
- Right to participate in school activities
 - Describe the activities your school will be having, how parents can find out about them and participate.
