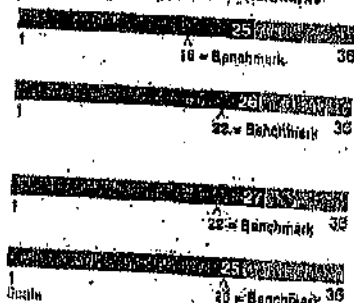

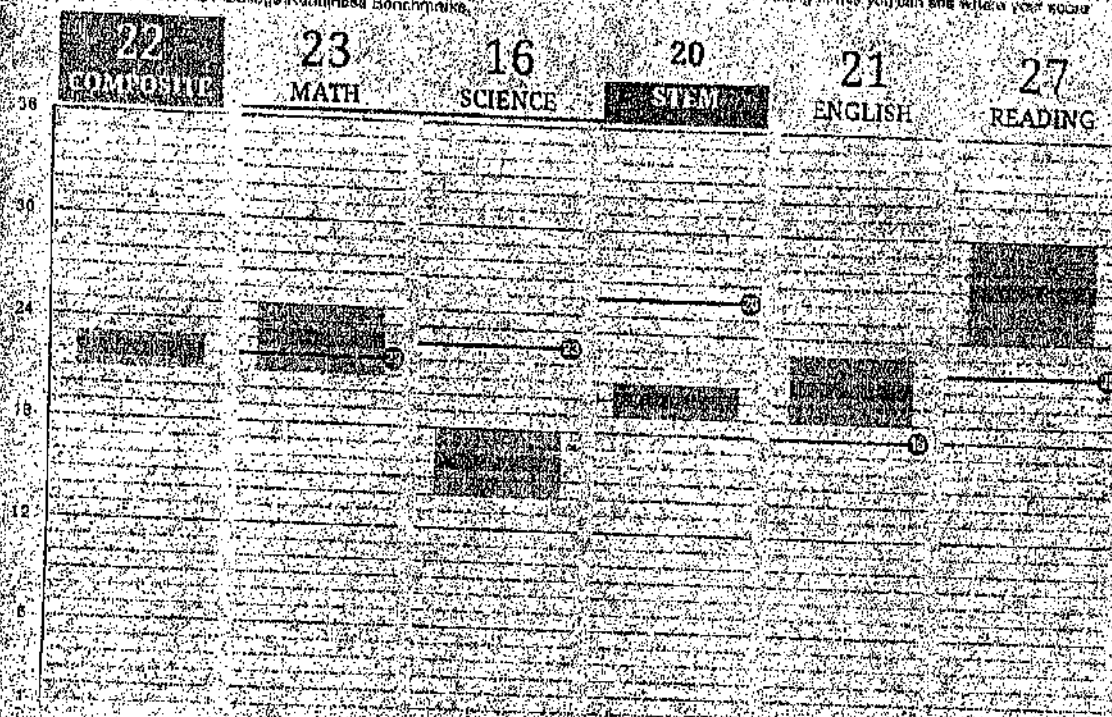

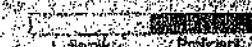

About the PreACT test and score scale

The PreACT is shorter than the full ACT and is based on a subset of ACT test questions. The PreACT is reported on the same 1 to 36 score scale as the ACT.

PreACT Composite Score: For each test we converted your number of correct answers into a 1 to 36 score. Your Composite score is the average of your scores on the four subject tests (math, science, English, and reading) rounded to the nearest whole number. If you left any test completely blank, that score is reported as 0.

Am I on Track for College?

Look for the green, yellow, or red symbols next to your section scores. They let you know if your scores are at or above the benchmark scores. Benchmarks show college readiness. If you see green, you're on track to be ready for college when you graduate.

How Do My Scores Compare?

A percentile shows how you scored, compared to other students. It's a number between 1 and 99 and represents the percentage of students whose scores are equal to or below yours.

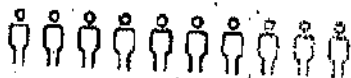

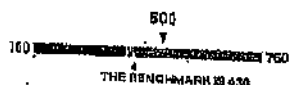

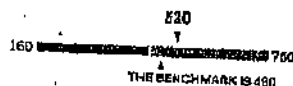
