Language Development Program




INTESOL's mission is to strengthen the effective teaching and learning of English as a Second Language in the State of Indiana while respecting individuals' language and cultural backgrounds.

HERE IS A BIG SHOUT OUT TO THE SKILLS FOR LIFE PROGRAM!

Students in the Skills for Life Program, located at the Area Career Center, have partnered with the Professional Consulting Group along with Purdue University Northwest. This new program targets students with a variety of disabilities from



ages 18-21, with a focus on employment and transition skills. While the students are in the program, Purdue provides them with work experiences on campus that match their skill level. This innovative opportunity is the result of the collaborative efforts of the School City of Hammond and Professional Consulting Group, a part of the Indiana Resource Network.

Transportation

The e-Learning day was an opportunity for the Transportation Department to come together for professional development. SCH Transportation met at the Area Career Center for a ½ day of professional development from 7:30 to 11:30. First, the meeting focused on the transport of special needs students, with videos and discussions that highlighted legal requirements, types of students with special needs, and how to respond to special needs students. The training then shifted to on-the-bus training, where participants went onto 3 buses and practiced parking lot procedures, driving in a roundabout and under bridges, and other traffic hazards that a school bus may encounter. Finally, the meeting wrapped up with an update on current transportation issues and an exit slip survey where participants gave input on topics for upcoming trainings. The next staff professional development will be on November 19, 2019.


