Pros:

- Each semester class is worth a whole high school credit (3-5 sem. hours)


Cons:

- Scheduling logistics
- Private vs. Public institution transferability
- Not all are weighted (there has to be an AP class at MVHS in the subject to get the weight)
- Not all rigor is the same

Comparing Transcripts.... What colleges see




This student attended College U

Other COTC classes transferred as electives.


Comparing Transcripts.... What colleges see

What path is right for you....

Things to consider:

- If you know where you want to end up attending college, call their admissions office and speak to a counselor. They can tell you what will transfer as it pertains to their particular major.
- Make sure equivalencies match up. For example, if a school requires a 4 semester hour composition class make sure that you are taking a four semester hour course to fulfill that requirement.
- Prepare for your ACT / SAT. If you took the PSAT, you have access to Bluebook with practice tests. Khan Academy also has practice for ACT and SAT tests. We usually recommend taking these at the end of your Junior year. Even though many schools are test optional, we are seeing many schools requiring testing again.
