Scholarships:

*Note: This list does not include scholarships offered by individual colleges or universities. Please be sure to check your desired school's website for information on scholarships for incoming freshmen!

Golden Leaf Scholarship \$12,000

These scholarships are made possible through a grant from the Golden Leaf Foundation. For more information and an application visit CFNC.org/goldenleaf. Also, students must have proof of NC residency (complete RDS) and must submit the FAFSA by March 1, 2018. The application is due **March 1, 2018**.

The Elizabeth City Foundation Scholarship Amount Varies

Students must be a resident of Pasquotank or Camden County; must plan to attend Wake Forest University, NC State, or UNC Chapel Hill; and must exhibit financial need. Apply at <http://www.elizabethcityfoundation.org/Scholarships.html> by **March 1, 2018**.

NC Alpha Delta Kappa Student Achievement Scholarship Amount Varies

Applicant must be a graduating senior of a North Carolina high school pursuing a degree at a school of higher learning. Applicants must have an unweighted GPA of 2.5 to 3.5 and an SAT score (including Math, Reading, and Writing and Language Tests) in the range of 990 to 1130 OR an ACT composite score between 20 and 24. Applicants are also judged based on their service to school, community, and church, as well as their integrity and leadership potential. Douglas Family Scholarship for Military Children \$5,000 per year

This fund supports children of persons who are/were in the military and are low-income status. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic merit, financial need, and involvement in school and community activities. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0. The application can be found by visiting <https://ffcscholarships.communityforce.com> Deadline is **March 2, 2018**.

2018 African American Network – Carolinas Scholarship Fund \$2,000

Scholarships of up to \$2000 will be awarded to seniors attending a 4 year college/university in NC or SC. Students must major in math, science, engineering, computer science, accounting, finance or business administration. Visit <https://ffcscholarships.communityforce.com> to apply. Deadline is **March 2, 2018**.

NC Farm Bureau R. Flake Shaw Scholarship \$4,000 per year

Scholarships are awarded to rising freshmen who demonstrate the intention to pursue a career in agriculture or in an agriculturally-related field, have financial need, satisfactory grades, and an evident understanding of the agricultural and/or agribusiness community. Preference is given to Farm Bureau members. The R. Flake Shaw Scholarship program awards six individual university level scholarships for a four year period at \$4,000 per year (\$16,000 total per student) and four individual community college scholarships for a two year period at \$1,000 per year (\$2,000 total per student). George & Frances London Educational Foundation Scholarship Amount Varies

Students can find printed copies of this scholarship application on the scholarship information board in the cafeteria and in guidance. Last year's scholarship totaled \$7,500. Deadline to turn in applications to school counselors is **March 7, 2018**.

SECU Foundation People Helping People Scholarship \$10,000

Student is either an SECU member or is eligible for membership through a parent/guardian. Must be a graduating senior who has been accepted to one of the 16 constituent campuses of the UNC system, already filled out a FAFSA and RDS, and have at least a 2.5 unweighted GPA. This is a multi-step application and requires a short essay. Students received an email with all application materials on January 8. Applications must be submitted *to your school counselor* no later than **March 14, 2018**.

K9 Memorial Scholarship 2018 \$20,000

Students can find flyers on the scholarship information board in the cafeteria. Applicants must submit printed application, essay, and sealed transcript to address on flyer by **March 15, 2018**.

The Elizabeth City Rotary Club Scholarship Amount Varies

Applicant must be a graduating high school senior who is a resident of Pasquotank or Camden County. Students can find printed copies of this scholarship application on the scholarship information board in the cafeteria. Deadline to turn in applications to school counselors is **March 16, 2018**.

Alpha Phi Alpha Thurgood Marshall Oratorical Scholarship Amount Varies

Applicant must be a male graduating senior who is a resident of Pasquotank or Camden County. This is a speech/essay contest on the following topic: "Where do we go from here: Chaos or community, 50 years after the death of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr." Applicants will be contacted in early April to compete for finalist round on April 14th at the K.E. The Elizabeth City Jaycees Scholarship Endowment Amount Varies

Applicant must be a graduating senior from a high school in Camden, Chowan, Gates, Pasquotank, or Perquimans County. Student must be enrolling fulltime in a four year accredited program at a college or university, or full-time at the College of the Albemarle or Mid-Atlantic Christian University. Students should possess or demonstrate the following: Academic success, GPA of 3.0 or above, Financial Need & Service to others through volunteer efforts with school, church and/or community. Sharma Family Scholarship Fund Amount Varies

Eligible students must be graduating from high school in North Carolina to attend a college or university in the state of North Carolina. Preference is given to those attending North Carolina State University. Applicants must have a high regard for obtaining an education and the courage to pursue it in spite of limited financial resources; demonstrate leadership, involvement in extra-curricular activities, friendship to others, solid work ethic and a commitment to academics; have a purpose and a plan for being a productive citizen; and demonstrate a commitment to diversity, recognizing the value of all people regardless of religion, ethnicity, socioeconomic status or ability. Janice M. Scott Memorial Scholarship Fund \$2,500

The amount of each scholarship will be \$2,500 unless otherwise specified, and they will be issued on a one-time basis. Visit <http://jmscottmemorialfund.org/> for more information and to apply. Students must mail the application by **March 31, 2018**.

NHS Class of 2008 10-Year Reunion Scholarship \$1,000

Students must be a graduating senior at NHS, have at least a 2.5 GPA, 0 out of school suspensions or major disciplinary issues, and planning to enroll in a college or university in fall 2018. Essay required. Paper applications are available on the scholarship information board in the cafeteria. Deadline is **April 1, 2018**.

The North Carolina Child Support Council Bob McGuire Scholarship \$1,000

Applicant must be a high school senior accepted to a North Carolina community college, trade school, or university in fall 2018. One parent must be a member of the North Carolina Child Support Council or a client of the Child Support Program (Child Support Services or Clerk of Court services). Student must have maintained at least a C average throughout high school. Applications are available on the scholarship information board in the cafeteria. All applications must be postmarked by **April 20, 2018**.

2018 Student-View Scholarship Program up to \$11,000

Students must be planning to attend a 4 year or community college or career/trade school. Simply log on to www.student-view.com and complete a 15-20 minute survey. A random drawing will be used to select the scholarship winners. Deadline is **April 22, 2018**.

NC Association of Educational Office Professionals Scholarship \$250 and up

Student must be a graduating high school senior who has applied for admission in a post-high school program in North Carolina. Photograph, essay, and letters of recommendation required. Winning the local (\$250) level scholarship automatically advances applicant to district (\$500) level. District scholarship winners will be chosen in October of 2018. *Applications were emailed to seniors on February 12.* Applications must be typed and returned to school counselor. Deadline is **April 25, 2018**.

2018 Buster Bynum Education Scholarship \$2,500

Applicant must be the child of an active employee in public school transportation during the past three years. This includes school bus drivers, aides, monitors, mechanics, parts clerks, foremen, managers, trainers, supervisors, directors, and inspectors that work in public education. Students must have at least a 3.0 GPA and plan to attend a college or university in fall 2018. *Applications were emailed to seniors on February 12.* The application must be delivered to the ECPPS Director of Transportation by **April 24, 2018**.

Master Gardener Volunteers of Pasquotank County Scholarship \$1,000

Applicant must be a graduating high school senior entering into agriculture, horticulture, botany or related field of collegiate study. Students can find printed copies of this scholarship application on the scholarship information board in the cafeteria. Deadline to turn in applications to Pasquotank County Extension Office is **April 30, 2018**.

Elizabeth City Lion's Club Scholarship \$500

Applicant must be a graduating high school senior at Northeastern High School or Pasquotank County High School. Preference is given to student with a visual impairment or a parent with a visual impairment. Letter of reference required. Students can find printed copies of this scholarship application on the scholarship information board in the cafeteria. Deadline to turn in applications to school counselors is **May 1, 2018**.

2018 Walker Morgan Scholarship \$2,500

NCSSM

The NCSSM (North Carolina School of Science and Math) is a NC residential public high school for juniors and seniors. Students apply during the sophomore year. Eligible applicants may apply to either NCSSM's residential or online program, or both, using one electronic application. There is no cost to apply and no tuition for either program. All NCSSM applications must be completed via the CFNC.org electronic application. All applicants must take the SAT by December 2, 2017 and have the scores sent directly to the NCSSM. The NCSSM application must be completed by **January 15, 2018**. Note:

Summer Ventures in Science and Mathematics

Summer Ventures in Science and Mathematics is a cost-free, statewide science and math enrichment program for students with proven academic ability, motivation in the STEM fields of study, and emotional maturity. Summer Ventures takes students beyond the traditional boundaries of high school science and mathematics while exploring topics of interest to them and learning experimental design, laboratory skills, instrumentation, mathematical modeling, strategies in mathematical problem solving and more. NC Governor's School

The Governor's School of North Carolina is a publicly funded residential summer program for intellectually gifted high school students in the state of North Carolina. Most students are rising seniors in high school, though students from the artistic areas may be rising juniors. Students who attend Governor's School are nominated by their school or school system and selected on the basis of grades, test scores, an application essay and, for arts students, an audition. Research Apprenticeship Program (RAP) at NC A&T University

This hands-on residential program for high school juniors and seniors will be held from June 17-July 13, 2018. Students will live on campus and work with research scientists to develop an independent research project. Participating students will receive financial compensation. Martha Guy Summer Institute at Appalachian State University

MGSI combines a residential experience with out of state travel. Following two weeks on campus at Appalachian State University, the program concludes with a week of travel to various business and cultural/entertainment sites. Each MGSI class is small. Twenty-four students are selected. The group size provides a much more intimate, personal experience for each participant. Tuition is \$1,900 plus a meal plan fee of \$350. ***Need-based scholarships are available to qualified applicants.* MGSI is seeking students who have a sincere interest in business as a college major and demonstrate leadership potential

Residency Determination (RSD)

RSD must be complete if you are attending a college in NC—it is required to receive in-state tuition. Students should use their CFNC user name and password. Complete RDS at <https://ncresidency.cfnc.org/residencyInfo/>

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

All seniors attending post-secondary education must complete the FAFSA to be eligible to receive federal, state or educational institution money. The first step is for both the student and parent to get an FSA ID. Keep it in a safe place you will use it every year. Visit FSAID to get started.
