Context

As part of the federal **Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER)**, Jackson Public Schools has received funding to address the lingering impacts of COVID-19 on education. A substantial portion of these funds will be used to remediate school buildings, including installing new HVAC systems, restroom renovations, & outdoor learning spaces. These funds are time-sensitive and must be expended by 2024.

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Pecan Park Elementary School

What Is Recommended for Pecan Park Elementary School?



Complete **structural repairs*** and **renovations** at Pecan Park Elementary School.



Shift Pecan Park's **Kindergarten – Grade 2** to nearby Lake Elementary School.



Shift Pecan Park's **Grades 3-5** to nearby Johnson Elementary School.

Why Are We Recommending These Changes?



Provide a **renovated school facility** for the Pecan Park community.



Maintain **stable school communities** that foster positive relationships between scholars and caring adults.



Expend time-sensitive **ESSER funds** to make strategic & efficient improvements to the school building.

What to Expect For...

Transportation

Transportation will continue to be provided for students; new routes are under development.

Leadership

Lake Elementary is led by Ms. Yosantas Burton. Based on the increased enrollment, Lake will receive an assistant principal.

Johnson Elementary is led by Ms. Guyniesha Johnson. Pecan Park (PPES) assistant principal Vanessa Dean will be reassigned to Johnson to support the 3-5 PPES scholars.

How Will Staff Be Affected at Relocated Schools?

The Human Resources team will prepare a change of placement letter for each team member impacted by the changes.

Certified educators were given first-priority to roles in the newly consolidated schools.

Operations team members are either being placed at their receiving school OR transferred to other vacancies within their departments. All classified staff have first-priority for roles based on favorable job performance.

Complete **structural repairs** and renovations at Powell Middle School.



Relocate Powell Middle School to nearby Brinkley Middle School for the 23-24 Academic Year.



Retain **Brinkley's 6th Grade scholars** in the Brinkley Building.

Provide a **renovated school facility** for the Powell Middle School community.



Maintain **stable school communities** that foster positive relationships between scholars and caring adults.



Expend time-sensitive **ESSER funds** to make strategic & efficient improvements to the school building.

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Jim Hill High School & Isable Elementary School

What Is Recommended for Jim Hill High School?



Complete **HVAC and ceiling repairs** and renovations at Jim Hill High School (Main Building).



Shift Jim Hill High School scholars to nearby **Isable Elementary** School for the 23-24 Academic Year. Continue use of the **9th Grade Academy Building**.



Retain Jim Hill's 9th Grade International Baccalaureate (IB) scholars at **Northwest Jackson IB Middle School** for their 9th grade year.

Why We Recommended These Changes?



Provide a **renovated school facility** for the Jim Hill High School community.



Maintain **stable school communities** that foster positive relationships between scholars and caring adults.



Expend time-sensitive **ESSER funds** to make strategic & efficient improvements to the school building.



What to Expect for Isable ES Scholars?

Transportation

Transportation will continue to be provided for students; new routes are under development.

Leadership

Lester Elementary is led by Ms. Sherekia Dixon. Isable's PK-Grade 2 scholars will attend Lester for the year. Ms. Deborah Smith (Isable assistant principal) will support Isable's Grades PK-2 scholars at Lester.

Marshall Elementary will be led by Dr. Jamaka Holman (pending Board approval). Ms. Catrina Crawford (Isable principal) will support Grades 3-5 scholars at Marshall.



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Reconfiguration: Lanier High School & Brinkley Middle School

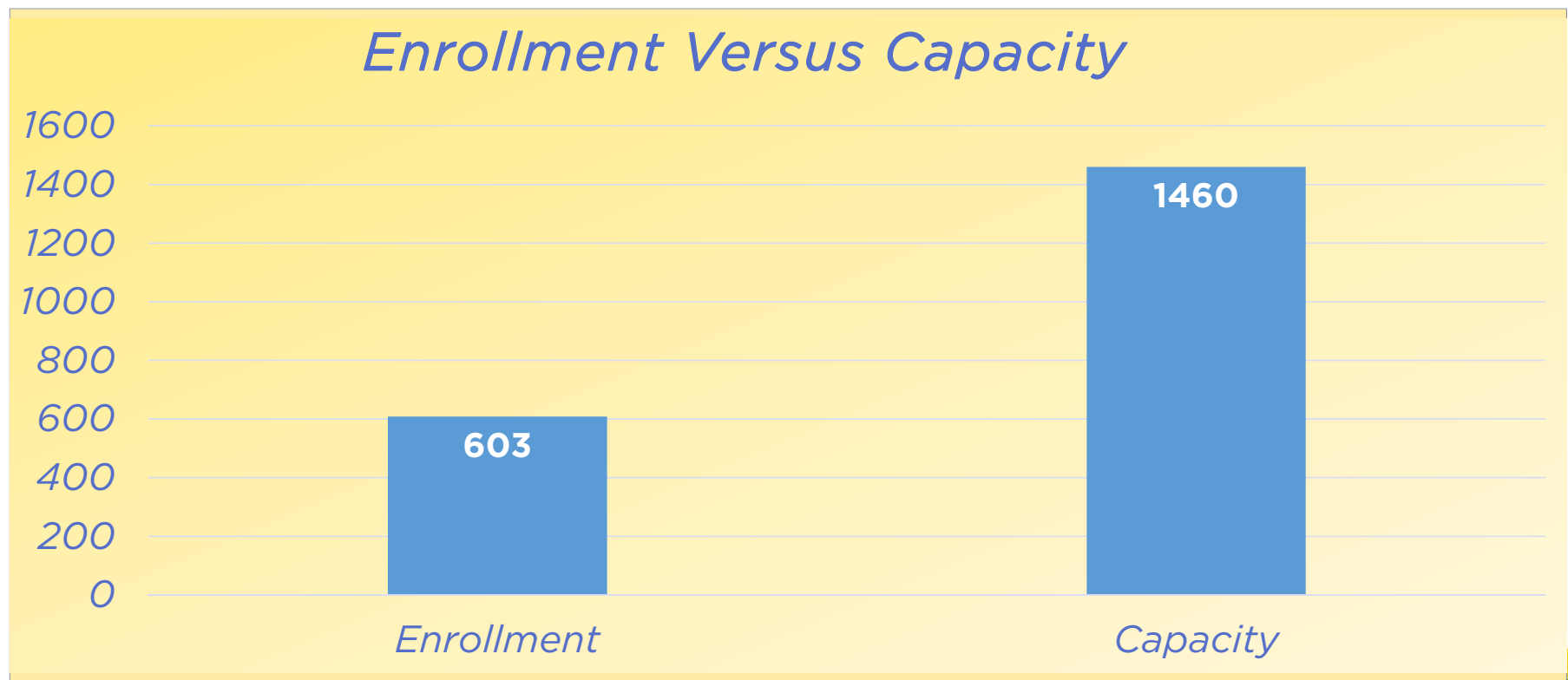
Our Plan for Lanier H.S. Feeder Pattern

What Is Recommended for Lanier High School...



Reconfigure Lanier H.S. as a **7-12 high school** for Fall 2023.



Brinkley M.S. **7th and 8th grade scholars** will attend Lanier. Brinkley M.S. **6th grade scholars** will attend Powell M.S.



Implement the **Community Schools Model** at Lanier H.S.

Why We Recommended These Changes?



Shore up the **Lanier H.S. enrollment** with the addition of grades 7 & 8.



Establish **stable school communities** that foster positive relationships between scholars and caring adults.



Maintain **fiscal sustainability** to maximize our current investments in teaching and learning for JPS scholars and their families.

What to Expect For...

Spacing	Middle and high school scholars will occupy separate wings of the building and utilize distinct entrance/exits.
Schedule	The middle school (Grades 7 & 8) & high school will maintain separate schedules in order to facilitate districtwide common planning.
Transportation	Transportation will continue to be provided for students; new routes are under development.
Leadership	The assistant principals (2) at Brinkley will be transferred to Lanier to support middle school faculty and scholars.

Brinkley Middle School - Building

**2023-2024
School Year**

Will house the **Powell Middle School** program for the full academic year as construction projects are completed at Powell's nearby campus.

**2024-2025
School Year &
Beyond**

Will become the new home of the **Re-engaging in Education for All to Progress (REAP)** program; Serve as district swing space in case of the need to relocate scholars and faculty due to adverse building conditions.



How Will Staff Be Affected at Relocated or Reconfigured Schools?

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Consolidation: Baker and Shirley Elementary Schools

What Is Recommended for Baker Elementary School & Why?



Shift Baker Elementary School to nearby Shirley Elementary School.



Baker Elementary School's HVAC systems have been vandalized and stripped of their components. These costly repairs can not occur in time for the comfortable start of the academic year.

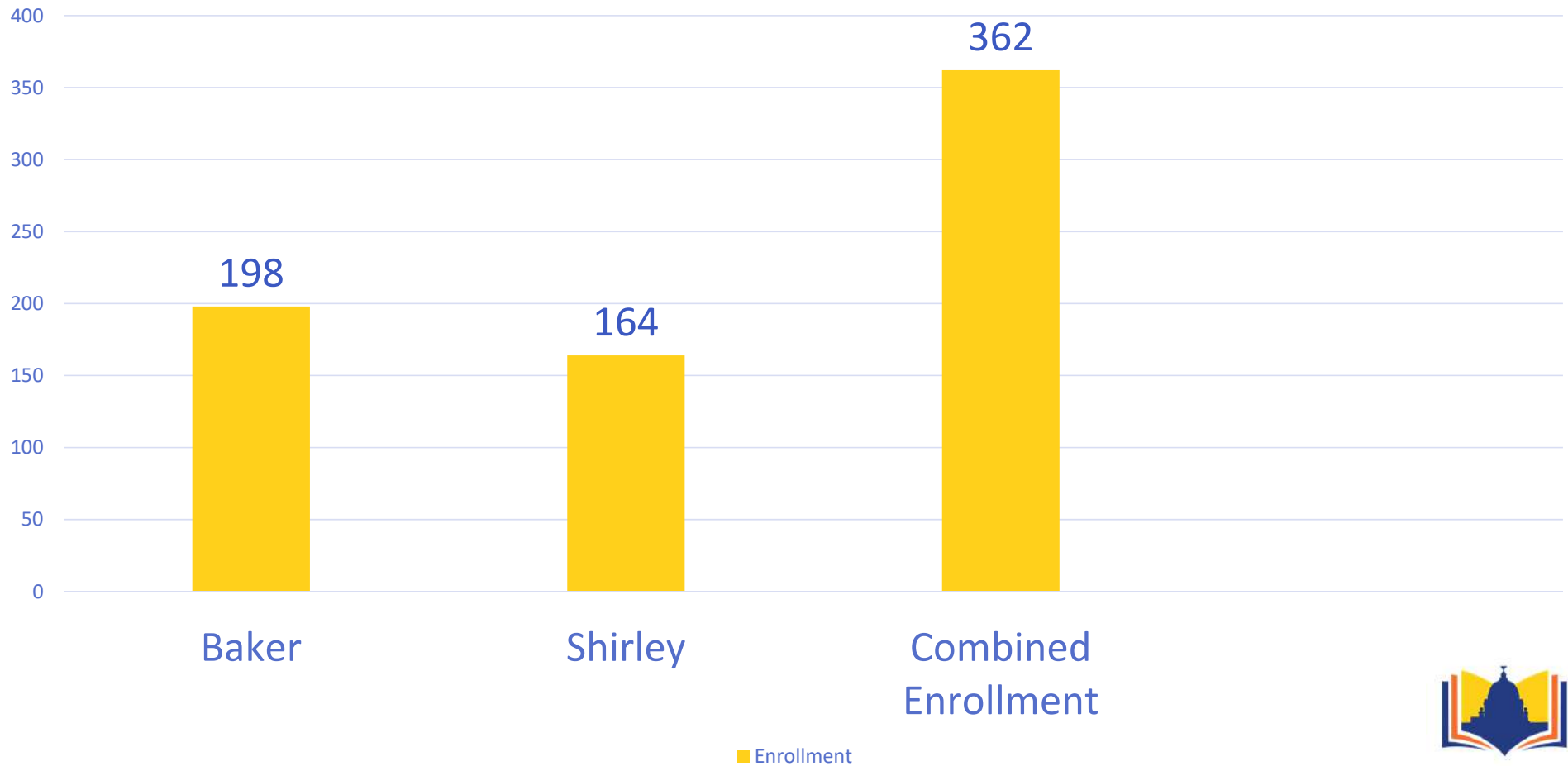

What to Expect For...

Transportation	Transportation will continue to be provided for students; new routes are under development.
Special Education	Students will continue to be provided special education supports according to their Individualized Education Plans (IEPs).
English Learners	English Learners will receive supports through the general education program at the consolidated school.

Pecan Park Elementary	Shift Grades K-2 to Lake Elementary; Shift Grades 3-5 to Johnson Elementary
Baker Elementary	Consolidate and shift full enrollment to Shirley Elementary
Jim Hill H.S.	Utilize JHHS 9 th Grade Academy Building, Isable Elementary, and Northwest Jackson IB Middle School
Isable Elementary	Shift Grades PK-2 to Lester Elementary, Shift Grades 3-5 to Marshall Elementary
