Hello Panther Families!

We are happy to report how well things are going at school! Students and teachers have been working hard on increasing skills and meeting goals, and great progress is being made. We look forward to sharing your child's progress with you at Parent/Teacher conferences on the 15th and 17th.

Our school currently has a "chronic absenteeism" rate of 33%. That number includes all students who missed 10 or more days of school in Trimester 2. Of course, some absences are enriching: when you take a family vacation and experience new things, vocabulary and context are improved and students learn in ways beyond what the school can provide. Additionally, some illnesses take a few days for recovery and we don't want students who feel awful (or are contagious) in the classroom. However, we do know that students learn best when their attendance is consistent, and we do all in our power to make their time at school worthwhile. It helps when you call the school to excuse an illness and make prior arrangements with teachers if you are taking your child out for a planned vacation.

As we get to know your child(ren) better through this school year, we are aware of how important it is to focus on students one by one. We look at lots of data - academics, behavior, growth and proficiency. It is the conversations with kids that warm our hearts and keep us coming to work each day. Knowing their struggles and seeing their resiliency is the light and joy of our jobs. Stay connected with your child's teacher and us, so we can continue to support each student's needs, whatever they may be. Have a terrific February!

TITLE TIDBITS

How we learn to read: The critical role of phonological awareness

Phonological awareness involves being able to recognize and manipulate the sounds within words. This skill is a foundation for reading success.

Three ways to effectively teach phonological awareness to prepare early readers include:

Teach children to recognize and manipulate the sounds of speech.



- · Teach children to identify:
 - Individual words in a sentence
 - Syllables within words
 - First and last sounds of words
 - All of the individual sounds within words
- Teach children to manipulate the individual sounds in words to make new words
- Teach the sound of the letter and then introduce the letter symbol for that sound
- · Use pictures that represent the target sound
- Have children practice their letter-sound understanding by identifying the sound and writing the letter

Teach children letter-sound relations



Teach children to manipulate letter-sounds in print using word-building activities



- Manipulate letter tiles or magnets to show how to build and change words
- Have children practice spelling and reading words using the letter-sound relations they have been taught



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
