Community

The Charlotte-Mecklenburg community makes excellence in education a top priority. In the 2012-2013 school year, our district fully implemented the Common Core Standards in Mathematics and English Language Arts, making the Charlotte Mecklenburg School system one of the first in the country to utilize this rigorous college preparatory curriculum. School

Established in 1959, South Mecklenburg High School is fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and offers a comprehensive college preparatory course of study, including a World Language Magnet program. In addition, South Mecklenburg High School is among a select group of schools nationally certified to offer the Project Lead the Way STEM curriculum in Biomedical Science and Engineering.

The 65-acre, college-style campus is comprised of 13 buildings organized by academic department. A new Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) building provides the latest in technology and laboratory facilities for advanced applications.

Over the last several years, South Mecklenburg High School has almost doubled in enrollment, to approximately 2,846 students, making South Mecklenburg High School one of the largest high schools in North Carolina.

Out of the 498 students in the graduating class of 2013, 48% matriculated to a four-year college or university, 43% matriculated to a community or technical college and 9% enlisted in the military or pursued job opportunities.

The Student Body

South Mecklenburg High School has evolved over the years to become a vibrant multicultural campus community. The current student population is: 43% White; 27% African-American; 24% Hispanic; 3% Asian; 1% other. Forty-four percent of our student-body receives Free and Reduced Lunch and 6% of our student body is classified as Limited English Proficient.

The Faculty and Staff

The faculty consists of 175 certified staff members, including two and a half facilitators, two deans, four assistant principals, a principal, seven counselors, and the support of two additional counselors assigned through the Communities in Schools program. Among our faculty, 44% hold advanced degrees and 22 staff members hold National Board certification. With regard to teaching experience, 42% have 10+ years in education.

Curriculum

South Mecklenburg recognizes the wide range of talents and needs that come with a diverse student body and we offer programs that allow each student to pursue their interests and maximize their potential:

- Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors courses are offered in most academic areas. These advanced-level courses
 are available to students through open enrollment. However, district prerequisites, coupled with schedule
 constraints, may limit the number of advanced classes available to a student.
- Electives and Career & Technical Education offerings including; a comprehensive Foreign Language program that is available to all students, courses in Computer Science, Biomedical Science, Engineering, Architecture, Business and Marketing, Health and Physical Education and Visual and Performing Arts. Our school also offers A Naval JROTC program.
- Additional electives and advanced courses are offered on-line through the North Carolina Virtual Public School (NCVPS). These online courses are available to students who demonstrate maturity and an ability to work independently and may be taken during the fall or spring semesters and/or during summer sessions.

Extra Curricular Programs

South Mecklenburg High School supports 24 junior varsity and varsity sports for men and women and has produced athletes that have gone on to successful post graduate careers in the NFL, NBA, MLB, WNBA and the Olympics.

South Mecklenburg students also have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of special interest clubs and service organizations, many of which have won national recognition, including our Science and Math Olympiad team, Odyssey of the Mind team, HOSA team, Band, Orchestra, Yearbook, and Performing and Visual Arts extracurricular programs.

Graduation Requirements

Beginning with the class of 2013, students are required to have 24 credits for graduation and must pass North Carolina State End of Course exams in designated core academic courses. In addition, all graduates must complete a comprehensive Graduation Project, which involves completion of a research paper, submission of supporting materials and a final presentation to a panel of judges.

Grading Scale/GPA Calculations/Class Rank Profile & Testing Data for the Class of 2013

- Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools use a weighted grading system.
- Classes are offered on a hybrid 4x4 and A/B schedule.
- Quality points are assigned on the basis of A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0. One extra quality point is added for each Honors course and foreign language courses beyond the second level. Two extra quality points are added for Advanced Placement courses.
- GPA is computed by dividing the total number of quality points earned by the total number of classes taken in grades 9-12.
- Class rank is initially determined by the weighted GPA on the 15th day of the first semester of the junior year and subsequently on the 15th day of each semester thereafter. Graduates' ranks are also computed at the end of their final semester.
