Location and Demographics

Loyalsock Township High School is a comprehensive 9-12 public high school located in Loyalsock Township, positioned on the east side of Williamsport, Pennsylvania. Servicing a township population of 12,000, most of the approximately 500 students comprise middle and high socioeconomic status. A sizeable number and variety of small businesses and retail establishments comprise much of the economy within the school district's boundaries. Even in recently evidenced difficult economic times, the Loyalsock Township economy and community remains very stable.

Class rank and GPA is determined using a 4.0 weighted level system. Students can earn credit among three course levels, including academic (weight = 1.0), honors, (weight = 1.04), and AP/college (weight = 1.08). All members of each graduating class are included in the class rank.

Academic Achievement and Recognition - A Snapshot

Students who attend Loyalsock Township High School have the opportunity to excel within a 21st century learning environment in which a 1:1 iPad initiative enables students to experience depth and breadth to their learning. Students can take a wide array of coursework within career interest and post-secondary focus areas. As a result, individual students have historically achieved at high levels and continue to be very competitive among other students nationally in a variety of academic areas. High student achievement has been evidenced on a variety of assessments/measures, including: PSAT/SAT merit and commended scholars; percentage of students taking and passing AP exams; and, above average Keystone Exam scores. A competitive student body, students' work ethic has earned our school such recent accomplishments as a consistent *U.S. News & World* Report Silver Medal Award recipient (2015 as well), an 89.4% Pennsylvania school performance profile rating, a 2014 recipient of the Governor's School for Excellence in Academics, and a 2014 National Blue Ribbon finalist. With a truly devoted, student-centered, and talented faculty, our students' achievement is a by-product of the holistic approach that LTHS faculty and staff provide.

LTHS's faculty consists of thirty-five (35) faculty, with twenty-five (25) possessing a Master's degree or higher. Our dedicated faculty have also found local to international success: a 2004 and 2012 Pennsylvania State Teacher of the Year Finalist; the 2005 Pennsylvania Assistant Principal of the Year; the 2012 Ithaca College Recipient of the S'Park Media Mentor Award in Communications; a 2008-09 AP Biology Teacher of the Year finalist; a 2013 faculty recipient of the Making IT Happen - Pink Jacket Award (ISTE); a current AP Reader for the College Board; a music program, recognized for the past five years by the NAMM Foundation Best Communities for Music Education; an Art teacher's support of the Rwandan refugee orphans' national Memory Project; and a faculty member's facilitation of the 2012-13 Jostens National Yearbook Program of Excellence Award.
