Location and Demographics

Loyalsock Township High School is a comprehensive 9-12 public high school located in Loyalsock Township, positioned on the east side of Williamsport, Pennsylvania. Servicing a township population of 12,000, most of the approximately 500 students comprise middle and high socioeconomic status. A sizeable number and variety of small businesses and retail establishments comprise much of the economy within the school district's boundaries. Even in recently evidenced difficult economic times, the Loyalsock Township economy and community remains very stable.

Class rank and GPA is determined using a 4.0 weighted level system. Students can earn credit among three course levels, including academic (weight = 1.0), honors, (weight = 1.04), and AP/college/dual enrollment (weight = 1.08). All members of each graduating class are included in the class rank.

Academic Achievement and Recognition - A Snapshot

Loyalsock Township High School provides students with a comprehensive, 21st century learning environment, providing enriching and well-rounded experiences across all content areas. LTHS utilizes robust 1:1 iPad technology within a block-scheduled (86-minute) environment, providing multiple holistic coursework opportunities for as many diverse student-learning styles. LTHS is on the forefront in Pennsylvania regarding STEM and College and Career Ready readiness, allowing for student exposure to a wide array of coursework within career interest and post-secondary focus areas. As a result, students have historically achieved at high levels and continue to be very competitive among other students nationally in a variety of academic areas, including: PSAT/SAT merit and commended scholars; percentage of students testing in and passing AP exams; and, above average Keystone Exam scores. A competitive student body, students' work ethic has earned our school accomplishments as a consistent *U.S. News & World Report* Silver Medal Award, an 86.5% three-year average Pennsylvania School Performance Profile (SPP) rating, a 2014 recipient of the Governor's School for Excellence in Academics, and a 2014 National Blue Ribbon finalist.

LTHS's faculty consists of thirty-seven (37) faculty, with twenty-six (26) possessing a Master's degree or higher. Our dedicated faculty have also found local to international success: a 2004, 2012, and 2017 Pennsylvania State Teacher of the Year Finalist; the 2005 Pennsylvania Assistant Principal of the Year; a 2008-09 AP Biology Teacher of the Year finalist; two current faculty AP Readers for the College Board; and, a music program, recognized for the past seven years by the NAMM Foundation Best Communities for Music Education.
