Two Year College

- Determine your program of interest. Are you looking for vocational training like dental hygiene, welding, etc...Check out your two year colleges!
- You can also attend a two year college and then transfer to a four year college to complete your bachelor's degree. A two year college allows you to "restart" your GPA to be admissible for the four year college of your choice.
- ➤ A two year college is also a cost effective choice. If you have a 3.0 GPA when you graduate high school and attend a two year college in SC you can receive the Life Scholarship which is up to \$5,000 a year.
- > Talk to an admissions counselor at your college!
- ➤ Complete the college's application. There is no deadline on when applications need to be submitted but the sooner the better.
- ➢ If needed, take the ACCUPLACER test. Or if you have already taken the SAT/ACT submit your scores.
- Apply for Financial Aid through the FAFSA starting December 1st.

Military Options/National Guard

- > Students interested in joining the military can start taking the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) in their junior year. The ASVAB is required for entrance into the different military branches: Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Space Force, and Coast Guard.
- The Army National Guard and Air National Guard also offer a job placement program and 2 or 4 year college tuition assistance.
