

Use these Search Options to Search Google like a Pro!

intext: – To search within the FULL TEXT of a webpage, example: intext:"Lennon was the greatest" (no space after "intext:"). This is a great way to search for your thesis idea!

allintitle: – Only the PAGE TITLES are searched (not the full text on each webpage), example: allintitle: "assassination of John Lennon"

allinurl: – Only the page URL address lines are searched, example: allinurl:Lennon assassination




Tips for Evaluating Websites!

	Popular	Scholarly
Who writes the articles?	Professional journalists	Researchers or scholars in a field
Who is the primary audience?	The general public	Other researchers and scholars
Do the authors cite their sources?	Maybe in passing, but you usually won't find formal references	Always - look for a reference list or footnotes/ endnotes
Are there ads?	Always	Rarely
Are current events covered?	Yes	No - the peer review process process is long

The Deep Web or Invisible Web!

Fact: 85% of web searchers use only search engines to find information.

The Deep Web is content that you can't access through a search engine like Google because it is not indexed on the web.



Databases!
