The Abisi Adult Education Center (AAEC) offers two types of classes for residents currently living in the Greater Lowell area: English for Speakers of Other Languages and High School Equivalency. We offer classes in the morning and in the evening.

To register for either class:

- You must register in person. No online or phone registration is available, and no one else can register for you.
- You must bring a photo ID and proof of address with your name on it.
- Do not bring your children with you. You will not be able to register if you do.
- Placement tests are given at the time of registration.
- You must be able to attend <u>all</u> of your scheduled classes every day.
- Classes may be full when you register. If classes are full, you will be placed on a waiting list until space becomes available.

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)



ESOL classes are for adult learners whose native language is not English. Students are placed in introductory, beginning, or intermediate classes to improve their reading, writing, and speaking skills. All instruction is in English. Students must be at least 18 years old.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY (HSE) TESTING INFORMATION

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is accepted by virtually all colleges, universities, and employers in the United States as exactly equivalent to a high school diploma. In order to earn the credential, you must take and pass one of two assessment tests, either the HiSET ® or GED® test. These tests are comparable in terms of cognitive complexity and rates of passing but vary in significant ways as well.

Whichever test you choose, you must take it at an official test center in Massachusetts. The Abisi Adult Education Center offers classes that will prepare students to take either exam and is an approved test center. We offer $HiSET^{\odot}$ testing appointments for both Paper Based Testing (PBT) and Computer Based Testing (CBT) and GED^{\odot} Computer Based Testing. Testing dates are posted below and on our website at www.lowelladulteducation.com.

Detailed Information about the two testing options, state requirements, accommodation for testers with disabilities, eligibility requirements, and other important information can be found on the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) website at www.doe.mass.edu/hse/. Denise, in the office, is also available to help you.

Barbara maintains the student records and attendance for all our HSE classes. She also teaches a Math class in the morning program.


STUDENT REWARD PROGRAM

The Student Reward Program is an incentive program rewarding students with points for having outstanding monthly attendance, achieving goals, and/or participating in school/community activities. Report your goal achievements to your teacher in order to receive credit for them. Each goal or activity has a pre-assigned point value.

The Reward Program statement is a monthly report given to students to show their point activity throughout the year. Once a month, students will receive an updated statement with their <u>total</u> Reward Points earned as of the statement date. These points can be redeemed for rewards (prizes/gifts) at the Abisi Adult Education Center. You only need to keep the most recent statement.

The Reward Center is located in the back of Susan's Room on the main floor. Throughout the school year, students can redeem their points when the Reward Center is open or accumulate their monthly points to save for a bigger reward. Students will find a variety of items for purchase: notebooks, dictionaries, calculators, pencils, pens, AAEC bags and apparel, gift cards, mugs, and more. Check our monthly newsletter for dates when the Reward Center is open. Each classroom will have a list of rewards available and their point value. Check the reward list to determine what items you are interested in and the point value for each item.

Remember:

- Reward Points are only valid for the 2018-2019 school year.
- Reward Points are non-transferable. You cannot give your Reward Points to another student.
- Remember to redeem your points before the end of the school year or before leaving the program.
- All sales are FINAL. There are no exchanges, no returns.

STUDENT ADVISORY COUNCIL (SAC)

Our Student Advisory Council (SAC) consists of AAEC students, the Program Director, and several staff members. Students who serve on the Student Advisory Council are elected by their peers or volunteer to represent their classmates.

This group meets monthly to discuss the concerns of students and to communicate their ideas on important aspects of the program. The SAC will work together with Adriana and staff members to bring a variety of activities and health programs to students of AAEC. Please help them by volunteering, participating, and sharing your ideas.

Being a student council member is a good opportunity to develop leadership skills and practice English. Reward points are also awarded.


ESOL DISTANCE LEARNING

Distance Learning is learning outside of the traditional classroom through webinars and/or online courses. Students use email to communicate with the instructors and the internet to complete assignments.

A small group of ESOL students from Meg, Susan, and Liz's classes registered with Jocelyn to participate in the Fall USA Learns Distance Learning course. This online course helps students practice their speaking, listening, vocabulary, pronunciation, reading, spelling, writing, and grammar. It offers a combination of online instruction and face-to-face classroom support. The 11:00am classes will meet on Monday, October 1st, from 9:30am-10:30am. The 9:00am classes will meet on Tuesday, October 9th, from 10:30am-11:30am in the computer lab.

The next session will start in January 2019. **Email Jocelyn at** *jmitchell@lowell.k12.ma.us* **if you are interested in participating**. Students are required to have access to email, the internet, and must be able to commit 5 or more hours a week outside of class.

PARKING

Parking is often difficult in downtown Lowell and can be costly. Students driving to school are encouraged to park at the Ayotte Garage, 1 Post Office Sq, across from Lowell High School.

On-street, metered parking is also available. Meters have a 2 hour parking limit Monday through Saturday, from 8:00am-6:00pm. It costs \$3.00/2 hours. The kiosk accepts cash and credit/debit cards. If a pay kiosk is not working, go to another one, and enter your space number. Do not forget to feed the meter. You may get ticketed.

- Do not park in the school parking lot.
- Do not park in the library parking lot.
- Do not park in the Santander Bank parking lot.
- Do not park in the Olympia Restaurant parking lot.
- Do not park in the Lowell Housing Apartment parking lot.



Cars may be ticketed and towed.

CELL PHONE REMINDERS

Cell phones are not allowed to be used during class time unless your teacher says it's alright.



Remember to turn your cell phone off or put it on silent mode before you enter your classes, then put it away. When a cell phone go off in class, it distracts everyone and takes away from your learning.

If you need to take a call due to an emergency, like work or child's school, quietly leave the classroom and take it outside into the hallway. Then, quickly return to your class.

VISITOR POLICY

Lowell Public School Visitor Policy states all outside visitors must report to the main office and sign-in and out.

For the safety of all our AAEC students, outside visitors are not allowed to contact students during class time or to interrupt classes. If you forget something at home or someone needs to leave something for you, make arrangements to meet them after class. Deliveries and drop-offs are not accepted in the office. Please make sure you have all of your materials and items before you leave for school. Your class time is short and important for your continued success.

If there is an emergency, please speak with the office staff, and they can assist you.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS/DELAYS

The weather is always unpredictable in New England. In case of inclement weather, the Lowell Public Schools may cancel school or have a delayed opening. For example, last October, stormy weather and high winds knocked out power to many Lowell schools and residents resulting in school closings or delays.



Remember, we are part of the Lowell Public Schools and follow their school closing and delay policies.

IF THERE IS NO SCHOOL IN THE LOWELL PUBLIC SCHOOLS—MORNING AND EVENING CLASSES ARE CANCELLED.

IF THERE IS A TWO HOUR DELAY IN THE LOWELL PUBLIC SCHOOLS—ONLY THE 11:00AM CLASSES WILL BE HELD. EVENING CLASSES MEET AT THE REGULAR TIME.

LCHC has partnered with the Abisi Adult Education Center to bring several mini clinics to our students throughout the school year. Our first mini clinic was held on Thursday, September 27. Students were able to participate in either blood pressure screenings or blood glucose screenings (diabetes), get a flu shot, and get information about LCHC services, programs, and health insurance.

MERRIMACK VALLEY HOUSING PARTNERSHIP (MVHP)

Looking to buy your first home? Project Genesis is a series of training seminars for first-time home buyers. It consists of 10 hours of instruction over four evenings. There is a fee to register for this course.

It is taught by MVHP staff as well as several volunteer real estate professionals. Instructors include lenders, attorneys, home inspectors, real estate brokers, and others.

Topics covered include an overview of the home-buying process, mortgage application process, down payment assistance, home inspections, building good credit, and more. These classes are offered in English, Spanish, and Khmer.
