


As you may have heard, the official testing results for the 2018 - 2019 school year have been released. I am proud to announce that Marshville Elementary sustained their previous overall growth! While with a School Performance Grade of a C, our students met growth in all academic areas - reading, math and science. In fact, our students grew over 23 points in science - that's nearly two letter grades!

This news is evidence of the hard work of our students and staff. Our school performance grade is calculated based on standardized test results in 3rd - 5th grade, so we recognize and celebrate our 3rd - 5th grade teachers for all of their hard work getting our students ready. We also recognize our K-2 teachers for preparing our students in the early grades, our special area teachers for engaging our students in the arts and physical education, and assistants and other area teachers for meeting the needs of every child. We also recognize the work of our community and our families. They say "it takes a village to raise a child, and this is evidenced in our Marshville family.

However, standardized test scores only give us part of the story. Our teachers have shown that they are moving our students academically through all measurable standards, but we also must acknowledge the work they put into our student by building character - teacher students to be kind, to respect each other and to work hard.
