Our School

SHS is one of seven Bend - La Pine School District comprehensive high schools serving students in grades nine through twelve. Graduation Requirements

An **Honors Diploma** requires 27 class credits. Students must complete five “Capstone classes” (three of which must be Advanced Placement). An **Academic Diploma** will be awarded to each student who has satisfactorily completed all state and local requirements for 26 units of credit, competency, and attendance.
