- 107 students attending "Most Competitive" schools
 - 37.9% of 4-year college-bound
 - 34.3% of all college-bound students
 - 32.3% of Class of 2017
- □ 116 students attend MC & HC+
 - 41.1% of 4-year college-bound
 - 35% of Class of 2017

 - Location
 - Campus life/atmosphere
 - Social fit
 - Family responsibility
 - And more...

Early Decision

- 116 ED applications (including 13 EDII)
- 110 students applied ED (35.3% of college-going students)
- 79 acceptances ED overall (68% admit rate ED)
- 90 ED apps to "Most Competitive" schools
 - 57 acceptances to "MC"
 - 63.3% ED admit rate to "MC"



First Generation College Students

- n = 68 (20.5% of class)
- 386 applications (249 acceptances)

More than 88% pursuing college

28 apps to MC \rightarrow 6 acceptances \rightarrow 2 attend

Low-Income Students

- receive Free or Reduced lunch
- n = 52 (15.7% of class)
- 280 applications (172 acceptances) = 61.4% admit rate
- 2- and 4-year college-going rate = 88.4%
- □ 41 MC apps \rightarrow 6 acceptances \rightarrow 2 attending
