

- Last year Somerville High School had a <u>high absenteeism rate</u>
- Majority of students who failed MCAS exams and who failed classes had
 18 or more absences for the year

- Increasing opportunities for students to participate in an in-school internship, work based learning program, coop (CTE), early college programs, and/or dual enrollment







Achievement Level District and State Comparison Spring 2022 MCAS (% students)




MCAS Achievement Analysis Spring 2019, 2021, & 2022

- That is an 8% increase from SY 2021-2022




Work Based Learning & In School Internships

Multilingual Learner Education (MLE) Program



- The <u>Newcomer Seminar</u> program has had a very successful start to its pilot year (staffed by multilingual school adjustment counselor); 48 students currently enrolled in Semester 1 seminar courses
- **Elm Community** continues to provide culturally and linguistically appropriate supports to youth of immigrant and refugee backgrounds and their families. This year we welcomed Yahaira-Maria Frier as our new AP, and Joel Villegas as our new Dean of Students!
- The NEST (Newcomer Education Success Team) educator team meets weekly for professional development on instructional practices to support newcomers/slife with a focus on alignment across the content areas. Educators also have a weekly team meeting where individual students are discussed and collaborative academic support plans are enacted.

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English Department

- English Department's commitment to Critical Literacy
 - Increasing diverse voices in texts
 - O Department mission statement: We believe that critical thinking is not simply a set of skills, but also a tool for students to engage with, understand, and navigate their place in the world. We will help students cultivate a critical literacy where they approach texts with a critical eye in order to analyze and understand the systems at play in our society so they can act as agents of change toward a more just world for everyone.
- The English Department has strengthen its commitment to critical literacy. We've increased diverse voices in our literature -- some grade levels are as high as 90% of literature coming from diverse voices -- and have worked together in professional development and learning communities to shift student learning around critical literacy.
- After two years of pausing the Senior Capstone projects, we are excited to begin this work later this year! Seniors will explore topics of their choosing around social justice and community issues, and showcase their talents and learning when they present their Capstone projects in May.

Special Education

- **-Vicki Cochran, CTE/Transition Specialist** provides specialized instruction to a range of special education students in the CTE programs as well as travel training and coaching on transition related skills in a new Transition Prep class offered this year.
- **-Partnerships** with Triangle, Community Work Services (CWS), Mass Rehab Commission (MRC), Department of Developmental Services (DDS), Partners for Youth with Disabilities (PYD), Boston Center for Independent Living (BCIL), Jewish Vocational Service (JVS), Mass Hire, and more to provide students with additional training and employment opportunities.
- **-College Planning for Students with Disabilities Event-Partnered** with SHS CCR Department and representatives from Bridgewater State and Westfield State Accessibility Services Offices to educate students, families, and educators about the transition from high school to college.
- **-Paid employment** opportunities for students with disabilities through Target, Whole Foods, Somerville Community Schools, Stop & Shop, Somerville YMCA, and more!

SHS Science

The 2022 - 2023 school year is the third year of the science open honors rollout to improve access to higher-level curriculum. All core science courses (9th Grade Biology, 10th Grade Chemistry, and 11th Grade Physics) are now open In the spring of SY22, the Science Department also engaged in a three-part professional development on grading practices that improve accuracy and student motivation, and decrease bias.
