
Silly Monsters, K lesson

Read: Hungry Monsters ABC


Create: Silly monsters drawing

Read: Wild Things (if time)



Lesson objectives: Literature- Reading and alphabet review Drawing- utilizing shapes + lines to create monsters Creativity- Using imagination and freedom of expression

- 1. Read Hungry Monsters ABC to the class.
- 2. Ask students to imagine a few monsters they might like to create- suggest a few idea or take ideas for monster features and characteristics- horns, hair, spikes...
- 3. Tell students they can use their imaginations to create their ideas on paper- using shapes and lines they already know (may want to review shapes and lines). I will leave you black pens or markers for them to use. (If I leave Sharpies, remind students that Sharpies are permanent and not a toy.) I'll leave you a step by step demo on how to make some monsters and animals that you can turn into monsters
- 4. After students draw at least 5 (or more- you make up the number depending on the timing) monsters, they may color monsters with crayons.
- 5. If you have time, you can read Wild Things, have students share monsters with class, or re-read Hungry Monsters.
- 6. Students may take monsters home with them.



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
